Teachers employed to teach Self financing courses need to be paid dignified Emoluments	 The teachers teaching PG Diploma ECE courses are paid on hourly basis. The emoluments have been increased from Rs.200 per hour in 2011-12 to Rs. 250 to 450 per hour in 2014-15, depending upon the qualification and experience of the teachers. Extension & Certificate Courses are conducted twice or thrice a week for which remuneration ranges between Rs. 150 to Rs 400 per hour in 2014-15. In 2010-11 it ranged between Rs. 100 to Rs. 200 per hour. Payment of the courses mentioned below is made on sharing basis which is (50 to 70%) of the tuition fees. The Duration of the course ranges from 3 months to 3 years and they are held twice or thrice a week for two to four hours a day. The emoluments for Fashion

In 2014-15 a teacher is paid a teacher is paid Rs.11730 for engaging students for 4 days in a month. The average salary of teachers teaching the BMS Course was Rs. 14,540 in 2009-10 which has increased to Rs. 20,500 in 2014-15. The average salary of teachers teaching in P.G course was Rs. 13,250 in 2009-10 and has now increased to Rs. 22,667. Dr. BNCDC: The average salary of 3 employees in Class III was Rs. 9293 per month in 2010-11 which has increased to Rs. 13,517 for 4 employees in 2014-15. The average salary of 3 employees in Class IV has increased from Rs. 5074 per month to Rs. 9925 in 2014-15. The average salary of temporary staff has increased from Rs. 3166 to Rs. 6000 per month in 2014-15 BMS / B.Com (AFI) & PG: The average salary of the non-teaching staff in 2009-10 was Rs. 1900/- which has increased to Rs. 7660/- in 2014-15. The average salary of temporary staff has increased from Rs. 1200 to Rs. 7000 per month in 2014-15.
