GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSION TO F.Y.J.C. ARTS/HOME SCIENCE/COMMERCE

- I) Qualifying Examination: S.S.C. Examination of Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education, of March, 2015 or earlier. I.C.S.E. and C.B.S.E. An Equivalent Examination of any other Board March, 2015 or earlier.
- II) Admission to Gujarati Linguistic Minority and in house will be done by the Management of the College at the level of the Principal.

ALL OTHER CATEGORY ADMISSIONS WILL BE CONDUCTED ONLINE

FOR STUDENTS SEEKING ADMISSION UNDER THE SPORTS, CULTURAL CATEGORIES AND OTHER RESERVATIONS: Attested true copy of the relevant documents supporting the particular reservation is also required.

GUJARATI LINGUISTIC MINORITY / IN HOUSE ADMISSIONS

An attested true copy of the mark sheet of the qualifying examination is necessary.

For an **In-house** student an attested copy of the **School Leaving Certificate** also should be attached along with the attested true copy of the mark sheet.

In addition to the above requirements the students claiming admission under the Gujarati Linguistic Minority quota will have to submit the following:

- a) An attested true copy of the child's domicile certificate
- b) Gujarati undertaking (Provided along with the admission form)
- c) An attested copy of one of the following documents can be provided as a proof in case of any doubt, about the candidate belonging to the Gujarati Community.

Mark Sheet / School Leaving Certificate indicating fathers' or mothers' study in Gujarati Medium. **OR** A stamped letter on the letter head of the community Head or Secretary signed by the President. **OR** Vasti Patrak of the community where name of the applicant appears along with his/her parents name.

ONLY FOR STUDENTS' CLAIMING OF FREE EDUCATION.

Due filled in declaration form given in the prospectus.

- i. Attested true copy of the first and the last page of the ration card which includes the name of the parent/guardian and the student. Student should not be the fourth child)
- ii. Attested true copy of Birth Certificate (Student should be born in Maharashtra) OR Parents service certificate indicating last 15 years stay in Maharashtra. OR Telephone Bills/Electricity bills/Rent receipt etc. which establishes authentically that the parent is a resident of Maharashtra state for the last 15 years.(Bills or Receipt of the year 2000 and 2015)

If the above documents are not submitted at the time of admission, the student will have to pay full fees in both XI and XII, which will not be refunded

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR THE PROVISIONAL ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATE FOR STUDENTS COMING FROM BOARDS OTHER THAN THE MAHARASHTRA STATE BOARD

- i. Application in the prescribed form which is obtained from the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Education, Mumbai, Divisional Board, Navi Mumbai, Vashi 400 703.
- ii. Statement of Marks, **Passing Certificate** and 3 attested true copies of the same.
- iii. Leaving Certificate (counter signed by the educational inspector) and 3 attested true copies of the same.
- iv. Migration certificate
- v. Deed of Undertaking on Rs. **100/-** stamp paper. Specimen copy of the matter which **is** to be typed on stamp paper is given in the prospectus.

IV) GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS:

- i. Submission and acceptance of the form does not mean assurance of admission
- ii. Only one person will be allowed to enter the college premises for submission of form.
- iii. No admission form will be entertained either for submission or for admission unless all the particulars asked for in the admission form are filled in and the required number of documents and/or certificates are attached.
- iv. Full name in capital letters) Birth date, Birth place, Nationality and Caste should be written exactly as mentioned in the school leaving certificate.
- v. **Those students who do not secure admission by paying fees on the day, date and time specified will lose their claim for admission.** No claim in this respect will be entertained later for any reason whatsoever.

EXAMINATION SYSTEM

Students will appear for 4 exams in a year.

FIRST TERM

- 1) **FIRST UNIT TEST** (Tentatively in August)
25 Marks exam with Multiple choice questions for all subjects
- 2) **FIRST TERMINAL EXAM** (Tentatively on October)
50 Marks exam for all subjects.

SECOND TERM

- 1) **SECOND UNIT TEST**
Same as First Unit Test (Tentatively in January)

SECOND TERMINAL EXAM: (Tentatively in March/April)

70 marks theory+ 30 marks practical for each Home Science and Maths / IT

80 theory + 20 marks (projects/orals) for all other subjects

****** In the second terminal exam 20% questions in the theory paper of the subjects will be based on the first term portion.

ADDITIONAL EXAMINATION:

There will be one re- examination each for 1st and 2nd Terminals on Medical grounds as per Board's rule. 151 and 2nd Unit Test will not have any re- examination.

Standard of Passing: The final result of the students for each subject will be decided on the average marks of all the examinations. A candidate must secure minimum 35 marks out of 100 in all subjects including Environment Education, Physical Education. The grace marks are given to the student as per Board rule if required. Students who represent the college at state/ national/International level in sports will be entitled for grace marks as per the Board's rule on timely submission of relevant documents

NOTE: Physical Education & Environmental education subject exams (theory/ practical/ projects) are compulsory for students as per the rules of the HSC board.

SCHOLARSHIPS:

In order to encourage merit and to help the deserving students, the college gives a number of merit scholarships and free studentships every year.

In addition government Primary Teachers, Secondary School Teacher, Freedom Fighters and E.B.C. free studentships are also available for deserving students according to the rules laid down by the government. Prescribed forms of scholarships/ free studentship will be available from the College Office. After the expiry of the prescribed date, the application for the above scholarship/ free studentship will not be accepted)

COLLEGE DISCIPLINE

The College attaches great Importance to discipline and the same must be scrupulously observed by all students Failure to comply with any of the rules, regulations or requirements notified from time to time will lead to strict disciplinary action. Students joining the College shall observe all the Rules and Regulations of the college laid down from time to time.

- **In order to qualify to appear for the examination, the admitted student has to have minimum of 75% attendance per term as per HSC Board regulations. In the event of any default in attendance and discipline, the college authorities can take disciplinary action against the student including dismissal from the college, non-eligibility to write the final Examination etc.**
- **Students must always wear the valid Identity Card issued by the college with their recent photograph affixed, bearing the signature of the Principal, around their neck. They must present it for inspection or verification whenever demanded by the college Authorities and/ or Security Staff. No student shall be allowed to attend lectures, Practical' etc. unless he/she has his/her Identity Card with him/her.**
- Students must do nothing either inside or outside the college that will interfere with its orderly administration and discipline. They should not communicate any information or write anything about college to the press without the written permission of the Principal.
- **Students are liable to lose their term for disobedience, misconduct, misbehavior or for any act of indiscipline. Students must take proper care of all the college property.** Any damage done to the property of the college by disfiguring walls, doors, windows, fittings, furniture and such other things, is breach of discipline and will be considered a punishable offence. Smoking, Tobacco-Chewing, use of Drugs etc. are strictly prohibited in the College premises.
- **Use of Mobile Phones, Electronic gadgets, loud speakers etc in the College premises and classes is strictly prohibited.**
- Students are advised to switch off fans and lights when they leave the class rooms
- Students shall be decently dressed and should use good language and behaviour.
- **No association or organization shall be formed, no meeting shall be held, no person will be invited to address the students in the college without the prior written permission of the Principal.**

- No picnics, socials, excursion or tours shall be arranged without the prior written permission of the Principal. If students join an unofficial picnic, or tour, the College shall not be responsible for anything that happens in the picnic or tour.
- No student shall collect money as contribution to picnic, trip, educational visit, get-together, study notes, charity or any other activity without the prior written sanction of the Principal.
- Matters not covered by the existing rules will be at the discretion of the Principal.
- **Ragging is strictly prohibited in the college premises and outside. Students indulging in ragging will be punished as per the Maharashtra Prohibition of Ragging Act, 1999.**

EXAMINATION PATTERN / RULES

1. In the three year B.A./B.Com. Degree Course a student is required to appear 36 papers in all 6 papers in each semester. Each paper carries 75 marks.
2. B.A./B.Com/BMS/BAFI: First year exams of Semester I and II will be conducted by the college.
3. B.A./B.Com/BMS/BAFI: Semester III, IV, V and VI exam will be conducted by the university.
4. B.Design in Fashion Design: First and Second year exams of Semester I,II,III and IV will be conducted by the college.
5. B.Design in Fashion Design: Semester V,VI,VII and VIII will be conducted by the University
6. B.A./B.Com/BAFI: For Internal and External, separate passing is necessary. Passing marks for internal are 9/25 and external are 26/75.
7. BMS : For Internal and External, separate passing is necessary. Passing marks for internal are 10/25 and external are 30/75.
8. B.Design in Fashion Design: For Internal and External, separate passing is necessary. Passing marks for internal are 10/25, 20/50 and external are 20/50, 30/75, 40/100.
9. A student can be allowed to keep terms in 5 or less than 5 papers.
10. Students can be allowed to keep terms in 4 or less than 4 papers in BMS/ BAFI. Cross ATKT is not allowed for the admission in third year.
11. B.Design in Fashion Design : Students can be allowed to keep terms in 40% of Total Subjects.

Rules & Regulations

The college attaches great importance to the maintenance of discipline and each student must scrupulously uphold the same. Failure to comply with the stipulated rules and regulations will lead to strict disciplinary action.

Attendance Rules:
