- i) Short Duration and mini research projects for students.
- j) Academic Mentoring to be conducted and files to be maintained by mentors.
- k) Career Guidance lectures to be conducted by Departments in collaboration with the college's Placement Cell.
- l) Department Extension Activities to reach out to community for sharing the subject knowledge.

TEACHING- LEARNING PROCESS:

- a) Syllabi -To be shared with students at the beginning of the year.
- b) Time -bound: Daily Time Table and Internal Exam dates to be adhered to by teachers.
- c) Teaching Plans- Semester wise teaching plans to be followed.
- d) Pedagogy- To decide suitable pedagogical methods for the prescribed units and modules in syllabus.
- e) Group and Individual Learning – Group discussions, assignments, oral and written presentations, panel discussion etc.
- f) Tutorials and practicals are a part of curriculum in some programmes. The activities and assignments to be planned accordingly.

EVALUATION & ASSESSMENT:

The College adheres to the evaluation and assessment practices as prescribed in the University curriculum. Students are required to pass in Internal assessment and then appear for the External Exams. The First Year exams are conducted by the College and the rest of the years exams are conducted by the University.

Students participating in sports, extra and co-curricular activities or suffering from illness or absent for genuine reasons to be allowed to appear for re-tests.
- b) Assessment- Students to be given full access to understanding the evaluation patterns. Grievances, if any, for internal marks to be addressed by teachers. For University exams, grievances are addressed by filling forms prescribed by University.
- c) Open House for parents and students at the end of Semester I after receiving the marksheet from the University.

10. Research Horizon team for publishing its Journal at Jaipur International Conference.
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Dr. Harshada Rathod instructed the staff as follows:

1. Examination Committee to go 15 minutes before exam starts to the classroom. In case of any copy case, should be delt politely.
2. Every teacher has to be very vigilant during exam duty and have to see that students don't use different methods to disclose their identity.
3. Teachers have to be very careful before using Madam's name for making different announcements to the staff.
4. It is not necessary to give participation certificates to all students for every event conducted in the institution.
5. The XII Plan expenditure accounting will get over on 30th September 2017 therefore all the departments have to submit the account of their activities before 30th September 2017 and collect the money spent from Ms. Ujwala.
6. The University Semester Exam will start at 10:30 a.m. therefore the timing of college exams have to be adjusted accordingly.
7. The next College Development Committee (CDC) will be held in November and February.
8. In the Departmental Audit to be held in April this year, all departments have to see that
 - a. The activities organized by the departments fall under different criterions.
 - b. Overlapping activities have not to be done by departments.
 - c. As Foundation Course is not considered as Department by NAAC, therefore activities under this should be transferred to the department in which the teachers are working.
