- k) Career Guidance lectures to be conducted by Departments in collaboration with the college's Placement Cell.

TEACHING- LEARNING PROCESS:

- a) Syllabi -To be shared with students at the beginning of the year.
- b) Time -bound: Daily Time Table and Internal Exam dates to be adhered to by teachers.
- c) Teaching Plans- Semester wise teaching plans to be followed.
- Pedagogy- To decide suitable pedagogical methods for the prescribed units and modules in syllabus.
- e) Group and Individual Learning Group discussions, assignments, oral and written presentations, panel discussion etc.
- f) Tutorials and practicals are a part of curriculum in some programmes. The activities and assignments to be planned accordingly.

EVALUATION & ASSESSMENT:

- c) Open House for parents and students at the end of Semester I after receiving the marksheets from the University.
