Goods and Service Tax (GST) Compliance Management

Workshop 1st February to 6th February 2018

Objective of the Workshop:

The Goods and Services Tax which is being implemented from 1st July, 2017 is proposed to be a unified tax for the entire nation. The intended objective of GST 2017 is to replace a lot of other indirect and direct taxes like the VAT, service tax, luxury tax etc. GST is aimed at being comprehensive tax regime. Workshop intended the following objectives:

- 1. To create awareness among business professionals and alumni about the new tax reform of the Indian Government.
- 2. To educate the participants about the availability of input credit across the value chain.
- To study the various components of GST like composite scheme, GST council, Schedules of GST, Concepts of CGST, SGST and IGST, exemptions from GST, etc.
- 4. To provide information that GST has subsume all indirect taxes at Centre and State Level.

Report on GST Workshop

Department of Economics, Maniben Nanavati Women's College organized **5** days workshop on **Goods and Service Tax (GST) Compliance Management** in collaboration with **Ministry of Micro Small Medium Enterprises, Government of India**. The workshop initiated from 1st February 2018 to 6th February 2018.

- Delegates from various professions and alumni of Economics Department, MNWC actively participated in this workshop. The inaugural session of the workshop embarked introduction to GST and discussed the structure of GST in India.
- The sessions of this workshop was conducted by an eminent tax professional CA. Sandeep Ojha. In this course, CA. Ashok Jain, Head of Commerce Department, SNDT Women's University, Churchgate also conducted a session.
- The overall course provided information regarding various concepts pertaining to GST like Input Tax Credit, Composite Scheme, Classification of Goods and Services, Concepts of Levy and Collection, exempted items of GST, amendments

in GST, etc. All the discussion in the session was extremely informative and helped participants to acquire wide knowledge about the Tax reforms of Government of India.

• The valedictory session was held on 6th February 2018, where all the participants received course certificate by Ministry of MSME.

Outcomes of the Workshop:

- 1. Workshop created awareness about the cascading effect of tax and how it is eliminated.
- 2. It educated all the participants about registration and online filing of GST.
- 3. It enriched the participants that GST is structured to simplify the current indirect system. It is a long term strategy leading to a higher output, more employment opportunities, and economic boom.

4. It educated the participants that simplified and cost saving system as procedural cost reduces due to uniform accounting for all types of taxes. Only three accounts; CGST, SGST, IGST have to be maintained.





English Department: Community Extension service 2019-20 for NGO 'Spark-A-Change' at Juhu, Mumbai

The Department successfully commenced its second year of community outreach program partnered with spark-A-Change foundation. Eight FYBA DC English students volunteered at their Juhu Centre once a week for 2 hours. Our students taught 100 students in two batches (grade 1st – 6th) from August 22nd 2019to 20th February 2020 and completed 30 hours of Community Extension service. CASE STUDY

Simulated Case 6- MNWC MA Psychology 12.05.2021

Based on the Case given Below write a detailed Case History, MSE, Tests recommended, Case Conceptualization and a detailed therapy plan with techniques/skills that could be used.

BM, is a 24-year-old female from a conservative Gujarati Family. She currently resides with her parents and younger brother. Her relation with her parents was reported to be strained. She reported good relation with her brother and extended family BM came as a self-referral for emotional concerns. She reported to feel very irritable, anxious and in March 2020. She came for counseling in May 2021 and mentioned initially about self-confidence issues. She also mentioned she needed some skills to do well at an interview.

She seemed intelligent and was able to verbalize her need very well. She was very well groomed and gave good eye contact. She had good attention and concentration. She mostly spoke In English and Hindi and was coherent. He mood did seem dysthymic in the first session and affect was appropriate.

BM was born in Gujarat, soon after that her family migrated to Tanzania and she completed her primary schooling there. The family came back to India when she was in her 5th grade. She reported that she really liked coming back to India. BM reported that she had a very happy childhood, had many friends and also loved spending time with cousins. She reported being an average student in school. She reported being happy go lucky and not being bothered about grades or performance in school. The client reported that post her 11th grade she became serious about studies. She did well in her 12th grade and further pursued B. Tech in Electronics and telecommunication. She further did one-year specialized course in semiconductor technology from Hyderabad, which she completed in early March 2020.

Since the first lockdown she has come back home and since then her symptoms started appearing. She noticed that she was irritable most of the time, would start crying at small things and also found it very difficult to sleep. She had recurrent thoughts of her being not good enough and that she would land up a failure. She reported this to her mother, however her mother at that time said it is due to Covid period and said 'as time passes things will get better.' This caused strain in their relationship as she felt 'no one understands me'. She meanwhile took up a project for her training institute and was in charge of supervising interns. She was also looking at taking up a full-time job. However, she was unable to get a job in the location and the terms she wanted. Looking at her classmates getting her job, made her start questioning her abilities. In the session post the history taking session she reported her mood had deteriorated and she was again becoming as bad as she was in March 2020. She also reported more strain with her parents and she had lost appetite and sleep. Currently, she also reported frequent passive suicidal thoughts. The parents reported being very worried for her as she has stopped talking to them and has also stopped eating properly.

- **1.** To educate the youth on the importance of understanding gender and different gender identities.
- 2. To inform them about the transgender and non-binary communities.
- **<u>3.</u>** To lay emphasis on promoting and practicing queer affirmative actions.

METHODOLOGY: The methodology used was Participative.

OVERVIEW:

Volunteer For India (VFI) for VOLSHIP 2021 Bangalore Chapter in collaboration with RAAH initiative, Department of Child Development of Maniben Nanavati Women's College organised the webinar titled <u>"DECODING GENDER (Hint: It isn't binary)"</u> on gender sensitization and education of the youth regarding gender identities. The program was conducted on 18th of April, 2021, from 6pm to 7.30pm. The program was conducted online through the Zoom application and about 38 participants were present. The program was also broadcast live on the Facebook page of Volunteer for India. The esteemed speaker present for this program was Ms. Kajal Makwana; a Psychologist, Queer Affirmative Therapist, Mental Health first aid trainer and Graphologist. She is also one of the core and founding members of Volunteer for India.

The main aim of the program was to educate the youth on gender identities, gender expression and how to maintain a queer and trans* affirmative environment. The program had an incredibly interactive format, with the City Leaders for VOLSHIP 2021 addressing questions gathered from youth and audience prior to the event. The speaker Ms. Kajal Makwana very patiently answered each and every question posed to her. She explained the difference between the binary outlook society is conditioned to and the non-binary reality of gender. She highlighted how "trans*" was an umbrella term and the asterisk above it denoted inclusion of more gender identities than presumed by society. There was explanation about the concept of personal pronouns and preferred names and how they form an important part of a person's identity that must be accepted and respected. She explained that the space to understand one's gender identity has been kept quite limited up till now by societal norms that force labels on individuals, but we must take the time to explore and figure out our identity, we must break beyond the conditioning and learning we have done from societal stereotypes.

She also offered counsel on how to be an effective ally. Two important statements were made during the program. Firstly, she stated that "Unlearning, Relearning, Understanding and Actively Practicing" were the key steps in which there could be a change in the narrative for the LGBTQIA+ community. Then, Ms. Makwana also spoke to the audience of a model she devised herself of "ABC for Allies" in which A – Asking personal pronouns and preferred name, B – Breaking Boxes (labels and stereotypes we assign presumptuously) and C – Commitment to supporting, advocating for and actively affirming the community. She also emphasized that "Bodies do not equate to sexuality, sexuality does not equate to gender expression, which does not equate to the relationships a person may a part of"

She spoke of how trans folk who live in transphobic environments must ensure their safety first, before trying to educate others, since it is essential that their life is secure before they can truly bring about a change. She suggested online support, connecting to the community, therapy, research for alternative safety resources and organisation that can help and aid the trans community as solutions to such an adverse condition.

There was active participation and interaction from the audience. There were open discussions about the trans* community and the status they hold today in India, what is meant by "Gender Equality" in context of the 21st century perception, how the youth can work towards an inclusive and equal future were among other topics that were discussed when the audience was allowed to freely ask their questions.

The session was regarded with a general consensus as very informative and enjoyable. The vote of thanks given at 7.20 pm by a RAAH volunteer closed the ceremony.

RAAH initiative, Department of Child Development of Maniben Nanavati Women's College eagerly collaborated in this webinar by Volunteers for India.


complete the two tasks formerly mentioned. We remained in touch via e-mail with the members from Volunteers for India to ensure effective collaboration for the event.

RAAH initiative, Department of Child Development of Maniben Nanavati Women's College in collaboration with Volunteer For India (VIF) for VOLSHIP 2021 Bangalore Chapter organised the webinar titled "<u>ECLIPSING GENDER: A Step towards "Trans"forming Gender Norms</u>" on gender sensitization aimed towards parents, especially parents of transgender children. The program was conducted on 11th of April, 2021, from 6pm to 7.30pm. The program was conducted online through the Zoom application and about 26 participants were present. The program was also broadcast live on the Facebook page of Volunteer for India. The esteemed speakers present for this program were Ms. Aruna Desai and Mr. Atul Kumar of the Sweekar Rainbow Parent's Group.

The main aim of the program was to eliminate and correct any misconceptions, doubts or wrongly presumed stereotypes or beliefs parents held regarding the trans community and the upbringing of a child who does not identify with the sex or gender assigned to them at birth. The program had an incredibly interactive format, with the City Leaders for VOLSHIP 2021 addressing questions gathered from parents prior to the event. The speakers, Mrs. Aruna Desai and Mr. Atul Kumar, very patiently answered each and every question posed to them. They emphasized on how the parents should try to understand their child, put their child's happiness and identity first, before any societal pressures or expectations. As Atul Kumar Sir said, "A parent's love for their child must beat the fear of society." They kindly shared anecdotes and advice, Aruna Desai Ma'am being the proud parent of a brilliant gay son and Atul Kumar Sir being the proud father of a successful transwoman.

They provided counsel on what resources could be accessed by parents and others alike to know more about the trans community. 



The main aim of the session was to educate the transgender community on Gender Affirming Surgery; its pros and cons and available facilities. The program was very insightful, with Dr. Sanjay briefly explaining the process of surgical interventions. He carefully explained some complex terms like intersex, gender incongruence and dysphoria. He even explained the feminization and the masculinization processes. He took care to explain the surgical procedure of each facial part - namely, forehead, eyebrows, cheekbones, jawlines, nose and upper lips. Dr. Sanjay suggested the ideal age of hormone therapy to be started and how important surgical care is. He even suggested having a mental health professional on board while undergoing the surgery.

Further, an interactive Q/A session was held, wherein a volunteer of RAAH asked Dr. Sanjay questions from the audience.

Role of RAAH: Our Contributions



Beach Cleaning Drive

INTRODUCTION

Beach cleaning drive is the process of removing solid litter, dense chemicals, and organic debris deposited on a beach or coastline by the tide, local visitors and tourists. Humans pollute beaches with materials such as plastic bottles and bags, plastic straws, surgical masks and gloves and many other items that often leads to environmental degradation. Every year hundreds and thousands of volunteers come to beaches and coastline around the world to clean this debris. Many tourists leave their litter behind on the beaches after their picnic and activities. These pollutants harm marine life ecology, human health and coastal tourism. Clean-up is the process of removing solid litter, dense chemicals, and organic debris deposited on a beach or coastline by the tide, local visitors, or tourists. Humans pollute beaches with materials such as plastic bottles and bags, plastic straws, fishing gear, cigarette filters, six pack rings, Surgical mask and many other items that often lead to environmental degradation. Every year hundreds of thousands of volunteer's comb beaches and coastlines around the world to clean this debris. These materials are also called "marine debris" or "marine pollution" and their quantity has been increasing due to anthropocentric activities.

INTRODUCTION

Enough food is produced today to feed everyone on the planet, but hunger is on the rise in some parts of the world, and some million people are considered to be "chronically 821 undernourished". Food security exists when all people, at all times, have physical and economic access to sufficient, safe and nutritious food to meet their dietary needs and food preferences for an active and healthy life. There are many reasons why people may not have access to food even when enough is available in the aggregate. One of the most fundamental is that there is no guarantee that a market economy will generate a distribution of income that provides enough income for all to purchase the food they need. Food distribution is the process where a general population is supplied with food. The Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) considers food distribution as a subset of the food system. The process and methodology behind food distribution varies by location. Food distribution has been a defining characteristic of human behaviour in all societies, and recordings of food distribution date back for thousands of years. Most governments and societies are highly shaped by the systems created to support food distribution.

Rally on Awareness on Women's Allowance and Rights.

Women's rights are the rights and entitlements claimed for women and girls worldwide. They formed the basis for the women's rights movement in the 19th century and the feminist movements during the 20th and 21st centuries. In some countries, these rights are institutionalized or supported by law, local custom, and behaviour, whereas in others, they are ignored and suppressed. They differ from broader notions of human rights through claims of an inherent historical and traditional bias against the exercise of rights by women and girls, in favour of men and b Women in ancient Sumer could buy, own, sell, and inherit property. They could engage in commerce and testify in court as witnesses. Nonetheless, their husbands could divorce them for mild infractions, and a divorced husband could easily remarry another woman, provided that his first wife had borne him no offspring. Female deities, such as Inanna, were widely worshipped. Old Babylonian law codes permitted a husband to divorce his wife under any circumstances, but doing so required him to return all of her property and sometimes pay her a fine. Most law codes forbade a woman to request her husband for a divorce and enforced the same penalties on a woman asking for divorce as on a woman caught in the act of adultery.
