He has been a member of almost all committees of the Savitribai Phule Pune University, The highlight of his expertise, besides his teaching prowess, was his active involvement in NAAC accreditation work. He was the IQAC Coordinator of his college for 14 years and now He has advised several colleges in Maharashtra in the new accreditation process.

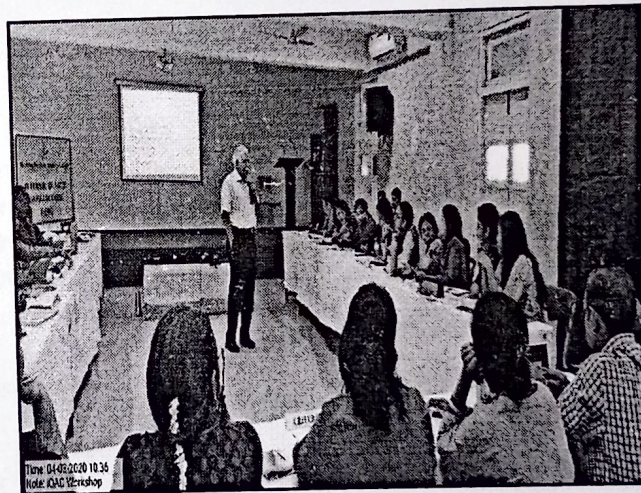
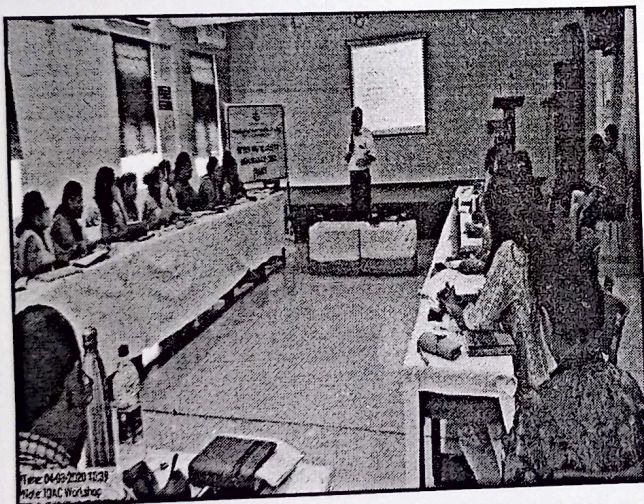

### **SEMINAR REPORT**

This National Level Webinar was conducted on virtual zoom platform for a duration of five and a half hours from 10:30 am to 4:00 pm.

Total 296 participants including Principal Professors, Associate Professors, Assistant Professors, IQAC Coordinators and Administrative

staff registered from the renowned, prestigious colleges and Universities from Maharashtra, Gujarat, Haryana, Karnataka, Kerala, Madya Pradesh, Odisha, Punjab, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu and Uttar Pradesh and attended the webinar.

The inaugural session was hosted by Dr. Rita Patil, Supervisor , IQAC Member , and Head, department of Food and Nutrition.

She began with a brief speech on the National Education Policy 2020, approved by the Union Cabinet of India on 29<sup>th</sup> July 2020

which emphasized the importance of academic flexibility, quality and overall development of the higher education system in India.

Dr. Rajshree P Trivedi, Principal, M.N.W. College and offered the Opening Remarks and a formal welcome to all the dignitaries.

- Smt. Himadri S. Nanavati, Chairperson, Managing Committee, M.N.W. College,

Dr. Rajshree P Trivedi mentioned that M.N.W. College is the first college to connect to the IQAC Cluster India and one of the pioneers in starting a whats app group of IQAC coordinators which indicates that excellence in higher education can be achieved through cooperation. The NEP 2020 would pave way for transformational reform in higher education system which aims to develop individual character, moral, ethical and intellectual values and provide skill based learning platform to students. Such transformational change would lead an equitable and vibrant knowledge society by providing high quality education to all.

Smt. Himadri S. Nanavati, Chairperson, Managing Committee, M.N.W. College welcomed the distinguished dignitaries, participants, teaching and non teaching staff and congratulated

the Principal Dr.Rajshree Trivedi and Dr.Twinkle Sanghavi and team IQAC for organizing the webinar.

Dr Twinkle Sanghavi, IQAC Coordinator presented/highlighted the objectives of the webinar

—

- To understand various methods and strategies for the implementation of the New Education Policy 2020 in Institutions of Higher Education in India,
- To review and reassess the implementation of quality parameters in institutions of higher education,
- To offer deliberations by experts on the roles of HEIs in reviewing their policies, strategies and methodology of promoting, nurturing and sustaining quality and excellence in all spheres,
- To provide a platform for conducting interactive and participatory session for exchange of ideas and opinions on quality and excellence in HEIs with special emphasis on the policy of inclusivity and gender parity and offering equal opportunities to all.

The Inaugural Address of the Webinar was delivered by Prof. Shashikala Wanjari, Vice Chancellor, S.N.D.T. Women's University. She enlightened the knowledge of the participants by highlighting the importance of NEP 2020, She mentioned that success in life and development of the society is also depended on the quality and skill based education provided to the students. Further she discussed that in current changing global competitive environment, more focus should be laid on diversity, complexity and excellence in quality of education to develop world class competitive work force, she also suggested the various principles which helps in achieving quality in higher education systems.

The Keynote address at the inaugural was delivered by Dr. Archana Thakur, Joint Secretary, UGC, New Delhi. It was a highly enriching session in which she discussed the role of Women's Studies Centers for women empowerment and development, NAAC quality parameters, policies framed by UGC to achieve quality potentials and to provide skill based education. She emphasized on providing world best quality education by opening Multidisciplinary Universities. She explained significant role played by Faculty and Academicians in imparting quality education to the students by cultivating critical thinking, learning by doing, focusing on communication and skill development programme and providing a Job oriented curriculum. She also quoted Mahatma Gandhi ideology of having

“Buniyadi Shiksha” and suggested institutions to have Quality Branding by focusing more on collaborative research work, to check and control unethical practices in publication, adopting innovative and competitive teaching learning parameters, skill based entrepreneurship programme, creating more awareness on gender sensitivity aspects, vocational, interpersonal and communication skill development, society industry linkages, human and moral values, adult education, promote heritage, culture and literature, innovation with sustainable development and having an academic curriculum providing employability to the students. In current Covid pandemic scenario she highlighted the importance of Information and Communication Technology (ICT), e - content development, Massive Online Open Courses (MOOC), Study Webs of Active-Learning for Young Aspiring Minds (SWAYAM) and other online certificate course as a best strategy to reach and provide quality education to the students. Further she suggested that institutions should provide a platform for the development of the faculties by conducting faculty development program and training program which would develop the sense of belongingness and integrity in the teaching fraternity,

The Vote of for the Inaugural Session was delivered by Dr. Rita Patil.

After the Unaugural Session, Session I - Impact of NEP2020 on Institutional Plans for Growth and Development = was conducted by Prof. Bhalchandra Bhole, Retd Associate Professor and Head, Dept. of Microbiology, MES Abasaheb Garware College, Pune. The session began with Dr. Rita Patil introducing the distinguished speaker. He conducted the first technical session on impact of NEP 2020 on institutional plans for growth and development in which he discussed about the proposed structure and regulation (NEP), efforts for development required by institutions and Teachers. He briefly discussed the roles of Higher Education Commission of India, National Higher Education Regulatory Council (NHERC), General Education Council (GEC), Higher Education Grants Council (HEGC) and National Accreditation Council (NAC) in regulating, standard setting, funding and accreditation of higher education institutions. In order to bring quality change in the education sector he emphasized the need to develop Institutional Development Plan (IDP). He discussed the importance of creating brand name, use of ICT, technological advances and disruptive technology in all areas of operating processes, industry academic connect, skill based academic programs, research intensive universities, inter disciplinary learning. Further he mentioned that students should be allowed to choose their curriculum which provided creativity and innovations in Job, develop critical thinking, problem solving, build team work

attitude, good interpersonal and communication skill and develop sense of social involvement.

Further in order to improve quality and faculty engagement in the institutions he suggested that the teaching fraternity should be allowed autonomy to develop their own curriculum, pedagogical approaches select their reading material and design their own assignments system. The Vote of thanks was offered by Dr. Anuja Deshpande, Coordinator for P G Department and Assistant Professor, Dept of Psychology, MNWC

Dr. Anuja Deshpande chaired Session II - NEP :Transformational Roadmap for HEIs. She introduced the resource person Prof. Dr. Vijay Joshi, Chief Consultation RUSA, Government. of Maharashtra. He discussed the key aspects of education policies framed by the various commissions from the year 1948 till 2020 and fundamental principle of NEP 2020. Further he briefed on the importance of flexible curricular structure, creative combination of courses, multiple exit points and revolution brought by Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) in the education system and suggested all colleges to be part of ABC to improve quality of education. In order to provide a quality liberal education he insisted more on creativity and innovation, introduction of Under Graduate (UG) program with multiple entry - exit options and flexible Post Graduate (PG) programmes, combination of choice based credit system, joint research project collaborations, use of ICT in the library. He discussed the importance of teaching fraternity which is the heart of transformation and would be directly involved in the final implementation of all the policies and therefore institutions should provide continuous improvement opportunities to the teaching fraternity by introducing faculty development plan, freedom to pursue research, curricular choice for their courses and introduction of differential reward system. The session ended with a vote of thanks by Dr. Anuja Deshpande

The Valedictory session was hosted by Dr. Ravindra Katyayan, Head, Department of Hindi, M.N.W. College. The session began with the reading of a brief report of the webinar by Dr. Twinkle Sanghavi, IQAC Coordinator, M.N.W. College.

. Katyayan then introduced the Chief Guest of the valedictory Session , Prof. Asha Shukla, Vice Chancellor, Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University of Social Science, Madhya Pradesh. She mentioned that India was earlier regarded as ‘Vishwa Guru’ and now time has come for our country India to set world class example of quality education by implementing rational education policy following all quality parameters.



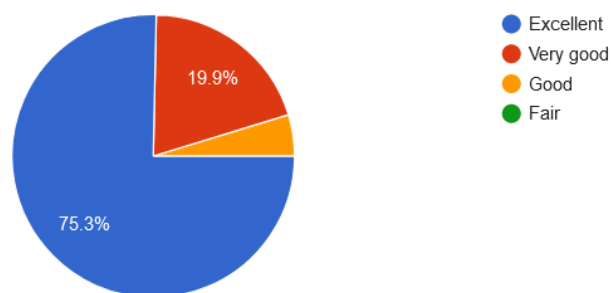

#### **Meaning of Culture**

The customs, traditions, attitudes, values, norms, ideas and symbols direct human behaviour pattern.

The members of society not only approve them but also shape their behaviour accordingly. They are the members of the society because of the traditions and customs which are common and which are passed down from generation to generation through the process of socialisation. These common patterns designate culture and it is in terms of culture that we are able to understand the specific behaviour pattern of human beings in their social relations. Cultural ideas emerge from shared social life.

#### **Definition of Culture**

##### **According to E.A. Hoebel,**

“Culture is the sum total of integrated learned behaviour patterns which are characteristics of the members of a society and which are therefore not the result of biological inheritance.”

##### **According to Bierstedt,**

“Culture is the complex whole that consists of everything we think and do and have as members of society”.

##### **According to Anderson and Parker,**

“Culture is the total content of the physio-social, bio-social and psycho-social universe man has produced and the socially created mechanisms through which these social product operate”

##### **According to Malinowski,**

“Culture as the handiwork of man and the medium through which he achieves his ends”

**According to H.T. Mazumadar,**

“culture is the sum total of human achievements, material as well as non-material, capable of transmission, sociologically, i.e., by tradition and communication, vertically as well as horizontally”.

**Socialization**

**Meaning of Socialisation:**

The new born is merely an organism. Socialisation makes him responsive to the society. He is socially active. He becomes a ‘Purush’ and the culture that his group inculcates in him, humanises him, and makes him ‘Manusha’. The process indeed, is endless. The cultural pattern of his group,

in the process gets incorporated in the personality of a child. It prepares him to fit in the group and to perform the social roles. It sets the infant on the line of social order and enables an adult to fit into the new group. It enables the man to adjust himself to the new social order.

Socialisation stands for the development of the human brain, body, attitude, behaviour and so forth. Socialisation is known as the process of inducting the individual into the social world. The term socialisation refers to the process of interaction through which the growing individual learns the habits, attitudes, values and beliefs of the social group into which he has been born.

### **Definition of Socialization**

#### **According to Horton and Hunt,**

“Socialisation is the process whereby one internalises the norms of his groups, so that a distinct ‘self emerges, unique to this individual.’”

#### **According to Green,**

“Socialisation as the process by which the child acquires a cultural content, along with selfhood and personality”.

#### **According to Lundberg,**

socialisation consists of the “complex processes of interaction through which the individual learns the habits, skills, beliefs and standard of judgement that are necessary for his effective participation in social groups and communities”.

#### **According to Peter Worsley**

explains socialisation “as the process of “transmission of culture, the process whereby men learn the rules and practices of social groups”.

#### **According to H.M. Johnson**

“Learning that enables the learner to perform social roles”. He further says that it is a “process by which individuals acquire the already existing culture of groups they come into”.

### **Re-Socialization**

#### **Concept of Re- Socialization**

Re-Socialization refers to the process of discarding former behaviour patterns and accepting new ones as part of a transition in one's life. Such re-socialization takes place mostly when a social role is radically changed. It involves abandonment of one way of life for another which is not only different from the former but incompatible with it. For example, when a criminal is rehabilitated, he has to change his role radically

## **Unit II Social Control & Conformity**

### **Conformity**

#### **Meaning of Conformity**

Conformity, the process whereby people change their beliefs, attitudes, actions, or perceptions to more closely match those held by groups to which they belong or want to belong or by groups whose approval they desire. Conformity has important social implications and continues to be actively researched.

### **Social Control**

#### **Meaning of Social Control**

Social control is the term sociologists apply to those mechanisms by which any society maintains a normative social system. It refers to all the ways and means by which society enforces conformity to its norms. The individual internalises social norms and these become part of his personality. In the process of socialisation the growing child learns the values of his own groups as well as of the larger society and the ways of doing and thinking that are deemed to be right and proper.

### **Types of Social Control**

1) According to Karl Mannheim- (a) Direct social control, (b) Indirect social control. 2)

According to Gurvitch social control is of the following four types

- (a) Organised social control (b) Unorganised social control (c) Spontaneous social control
- (d) More spontaneous social control

(3) Forms of social control as given by Kimball Young:

- (a) Positive social control, (b) Negative social control

(4) Hayes's classification of social control:

- (a) Control by sanction, (b) Control by socialisation and education.

(5) Forms of social control as given by Lumbey:

- (a) Physical force method, (b) Human symbol method

(6) Forms of social control according to Cooley:

- (a) Conscious. (b) Unconscious.

**General views about forms of social control:**

Generally social control is classified under the following two forms:

- (a) Formal social control, (b) Informal social control

(a) Formal social control:

This type of social control is exercised by known and deliberate agencies of social control, such as law, punishment, army, Constitution etc. Man is forced to accept these forms of social control. Generally these forms are exercised by secondary groups.

(b) Informal social control:

These agencies of Social Control have grown according to the needs of the society. Folk ways, mores, customs, social norms etc. fall under this category of social control. Generally primary institutions exercise this type of social control.

### **Unit- III Process of Social Interaction**

#### **Social interaction**

#### **Meaning of Social Interaction**

Man is a social animal. It is difficult for him to live in isolation. They always live in groups. As members of these groups they act in a certain manner. Their behaviour is mutually affected. This interaction or mutual activity is the essence of social life. Social life is not possible without interactions. Social interactions are give-and-take relationships which not only influence the interacting individuals but also the quality of relationships.

#### **Definition of Social Interaction**

**According to Gillin and Gillin,**

“By social interaction we refer to social relations of all sorts in functions – dynamic social relations of all kinds – whether such relations exist between individual and individual, between group and group and group and individual, as the case may be”.

**Eldredge and Merrill say,** “Social interaction is thus the general process whereby two or more persons are in meaningful contact-as a result of which their behaviour is modified, however, slightly”.

## Unit IV Social Change

### Cultural Lag

#### Meaning Of Cultural lag

Cultural lag refers to the phenomenon that occurs when changes in material culture occur before or at a faster rate than the changes in non-material culture. In other words, cultural lag is when technological change, or something similar like tools, develops faster than society can process those changes. Let's look at an example to better understand cultural lag.

#### Ogburn's Theory of Cultural Lag

The concept of cultural lag was first developed in 1922 by sociologist Williams F. Ogburn. Ogburn noticed that material culture tends to develop and advance at a faster rate than non-material culture. Material culture is the physical and tangible aspects of culture including technology, buildings, and tools. Non-material culture is the aspect of culture that isn't physical, nor is it tangible. Non-material culture includes cultural values, morals, and religion.

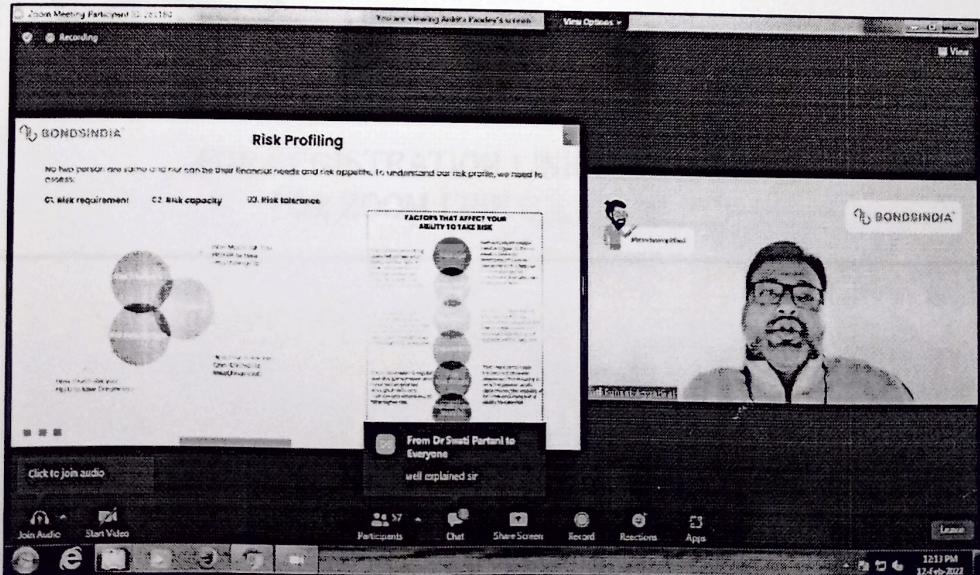
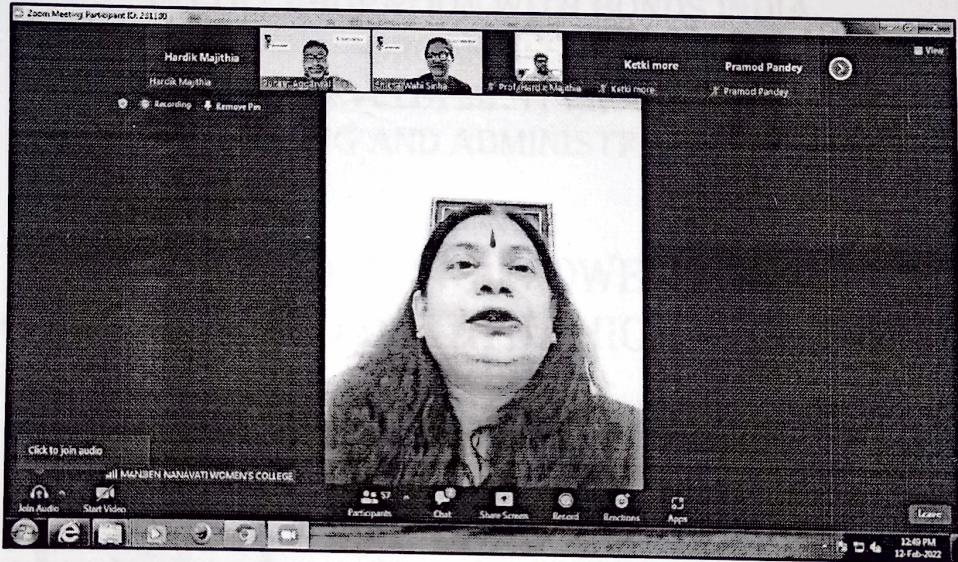
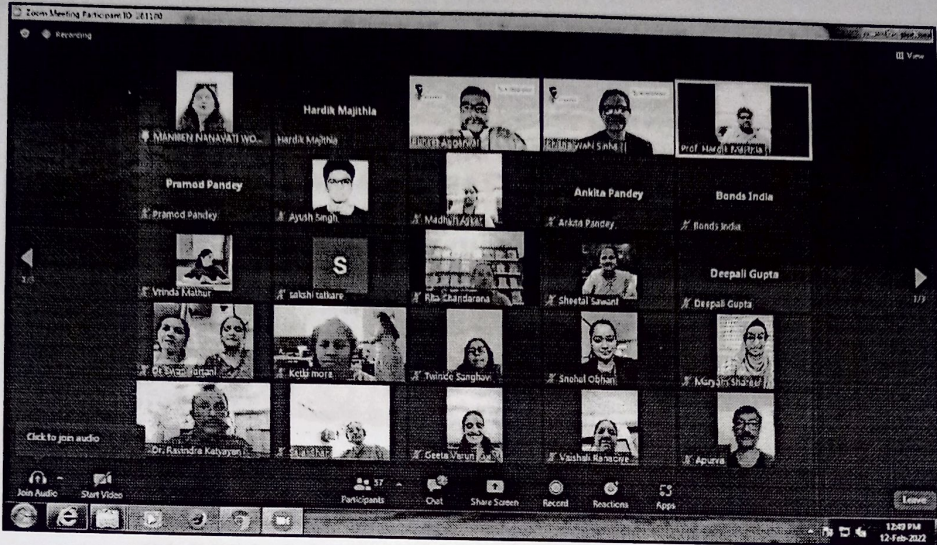
The program started with the welcome note given by Principal Dr. Rajshree P. Trivadi and then formal introduction by Mr. Pramod Pandey.

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# Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

The academic year 2018-2019 welcomed Dr. Twinkle Sanghavi, Head- Department of Sociology as the new IQAC Coordinator. Dr. Anuja Deshpande, Coordinator for MA (Psychology) and Asst. Professor of Psychology and Ms. Pranaya Revandkar were invited as the new members of the IQAC. Three students –Ms. Ayesha Patel from FYB.Com, Ms. Sakshi Sangekar and Ms. Juee Gotle from FYBA (English) were also invited to represent the Student Voice in the cell. All around the year, the following activities were carried out:

## A. Formation of the NAAC Senior Committee:

This special committee was formed to plan, guide and monitor the process of Academic Audit and the Standard Operating Procedures of all the 12 Departments (UG and PG) and the 27 Committees of the College. It will operate and function to accelerate the academic performances of the departments and will act as a supporting committee to strengthen the functioning of the IQAC. Dr. Jayashree Palit, Head- Dept. of English with her two seasons' experience of being the IQAC Coordinator during the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> cycle of Accreditation has been nominated as the In-Charge of the Committee. Prof. Sunita Sharma, Supervisor and Head, Dept of Commerce who is the senior most faculty member of the College will take over from Dr. Palit from August 2019 onwards. Dr. Falguni Desai, Head, Depts of Economics and Foundation Course and the IQAC Coordinator of the 3<sup>rd</sup> cycle of accreditation is the Co-Incharge of the Committee. Dr. Twinkle Sanghavi is the Member of the Committee.

## B. MOUs

Maintaining quality and excellence at each level for all the stakeholders and sustaining those efforts and initiatives undertaken are indeed challenging. The IQAC team of MNWC is fully aware of its role and responsibilities and encourages as well as involves the participation of each stakeholder in planning, key-decision making, executing and sustaining all the processes without compromising on standards at every level. During the academic year 2019-2020, the IQAC worked systematically and relentlessly to excel and enhance the quality levels of academics, research, skilling, value-added courses, extension work, alumni engagement, extra and co-curricular activities, sports, staff and student welfare, professional development internships and placements so as to nurture a comprehensive and all inclusive environment for all the stakeholders.

### **A. The IQAC report for the academic years:**

#### **a. Constitution of NAAC Support Committee:**

The first and the foremost step was to constitute a NAAC Support committee comprising of: Principal Dr. Rajshree Trivedi; Dr. Jayashree Palit - In Charge (IQAC Coordinator for the 1st and 2nd Cycle of accreditation); Dr. Falguni Desai - Member (IQAC Coordinator- 3rd Cycle of accreditation); Prof. Sunita Sharma- Member (Senior most Faculty Member) and Dr. Twinkle Sanghavi- Member (Present IQAC Coordinator)

The main objectives of this Committee were: to supervise and monitor the process of initiating and carrying out the External Academic Audit for last three academic years; to guide the Departments and Committees in making their Systematic Operating Procedures (SOP); and to monitor their SOPs

#### **b. External Academic Audit from 2016-19 on 16th April 2019:**

The NAAC Support Committee then undertook the initiative from June 2019 onwards to prepare for the External Academic Audit process for the years 2016-2017, 2017-2018 and 2018-2019.

The objective was to devise a systematic and scientific method of identifying the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and challenges of the departments and to enhance the quality of academic activities by chalking out an action plan for the future. The experts for the External Academic Audit were nominated from the "A" grade colleges of Mumbai.

The NAAC Support Committee prepared thereport and in a formal Feedback Session, it was presented before the Managing Committee members and the IQAC mentors in the presence of all the faculty members on 27th April 2019.

### **B. Annual Quality Assurance Reports (AQAR):**

The IQAC undertook the marathon task of uploading AQAR reports for the academic years 2017-2018 and 2018-2019 in a period of three months. It was a herculean task but we completed the whole process successfully in spite of the technical challenges faced on the portal.

### **C. Project Akshaya :**

Project Akshaya is an initiative of the IQAC. This project has been launched since July 8, 2019 as a welfare scheme for the students from the underprivileged background of MNWC. The main objective behind the launch of this project is to offer a nutritious snack at 10 am during their break on working days. The Department of Food and Nutrition volunteered to take the responsibility of the purchase and distribution of the food products.

### **D. Project NIRMMA**

Under this ongoing project, this year a major emphasis was laid on imparting Value Education and inculcating values among all the stakeholders. The institutional theme for this academic year being "Commemorating 150th Birth Anniversary of Mahatma Gandhiji: Gender Diversity for Peaceful Coexistence," the following activities were conducted. The Departments and Committees organized various talks, visits, value-based games, short play competition, research paper competition, street play and other events. Some of the collaborators who worked together were UGC sponsored, Gandhian Study Centre, MHRD,



Fredrich Ebert Stiftung and Gujarat Vidyapeeth Samatva, the Gender Sensitization Week was celebrated with a few well known NGOs like Majlis, Vacha, MAVA, Women Graduates Union, Shaolin Defense academy, Research Centre for Women's Studies (SNDT Women's University) and Lions Club of Bombay Airport.

#### **D. Project SHILPI:**

Under Project SHILPI, the skill development programmes are undertaken by all the departments. The regular programmes like YATRA, VITA, SARJAN, Advanced Excel and Kruti were conducted.

This year, a very remarkable addition to these programmes came as Tata Institute of Social sciences (TISS) under their National University's Student Skill Development (NUSSD) project signed an MOU with the College. TISS conducted 3 courses: Banking and Finance; Digital Marketing; and Hospital Management- for the Third Year students of BA, B.com, BMS and B.Com (AFI).

#### **E. Project SANNARI:**

Under this project, the faculty members have reinforced their use of ICT based Teaching-Learning methods by incorporating the use of Zoom, Google and other online classrooms. Smart Classrooms have become an integral part of teaching-learning process. The post-graduate interns hosted by the Departments of English and Economics have developed a few modules for providing online study material.

# Internal Quality Assurance Cell

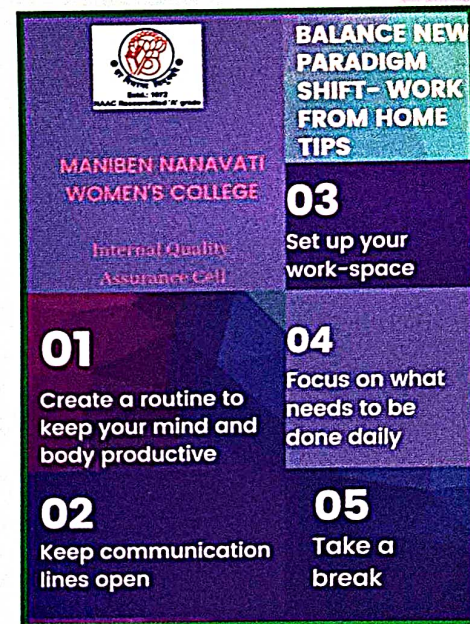
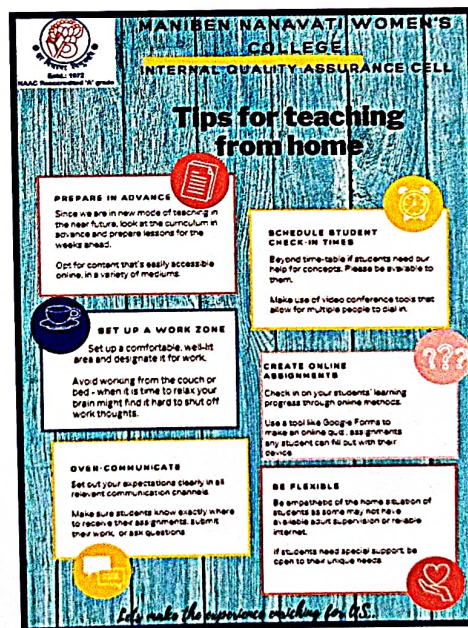
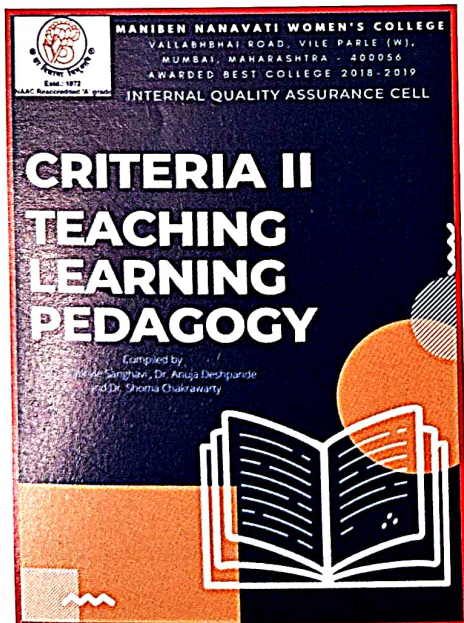
The Internal Quality Assurance Cell of the college has been conscious of its role of being a catalyst "to improve the academic and administrative performance of the institution." Keeping the five core values recommended by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) and the seven criteria for assessment under Quality Indicator Framework, the IQAC continuously works towards the sustainability of excellence levels in the institution. With the help of NAAC Support Committee, the IQAC strategically worked out plans in coordination with the Departments and Committees for the academic year 2020-2021. The following initiatives were undertaken:

## 1. Curriculum Aspects:

- ❖ For the year 2020-21, the college applied to National Skills Qualifications Framework (NSQF), a scheme of University Grants Commission (UGC) for two certificate courses i.e. Hospital and Healthcare Management and Customer Relationship Management. The College has received approval for both courses which started in December 2020.
- ❖ Under the MOU with TISS, the courses on Banking & Finance Services and digital Marketing continues.
- ❖ UGC's SWAYAM NPTEL local chapter registration continues

## 2. Teaching - Learning & Evaluation :

The year 2020-2021 began and ended under the severe spell of the COVID 19 Pandemic. It has indeed been very difficult year for all of us specially for teachers who had to learn new pedagogies, methodologies and tools to keep students engaged in online ways of learning. The IQAC team designed a booklet that offered guidelines to teachers for the implementation of student-centric methods to enhance their teaching pedagogies in classroom. Creative brochures offering simple tips for teaching-learning and coping up with Work From Home culture were shared with teachers.



- ❖ The faculty members were encouraged to attend online webinars and Faculty Development Programmes related to online teaching-learning and evaluation practices during the Pandemic times. Most of them have successfully completed them.

- ❖ Launch of Youth for Mission, Action and Intellect (YAMI) - Let's Think Together to foster an environment that stimulates the youth to think for themselves and the world around them.

- ❖ Online counselling services by Santvana Mental Health Services



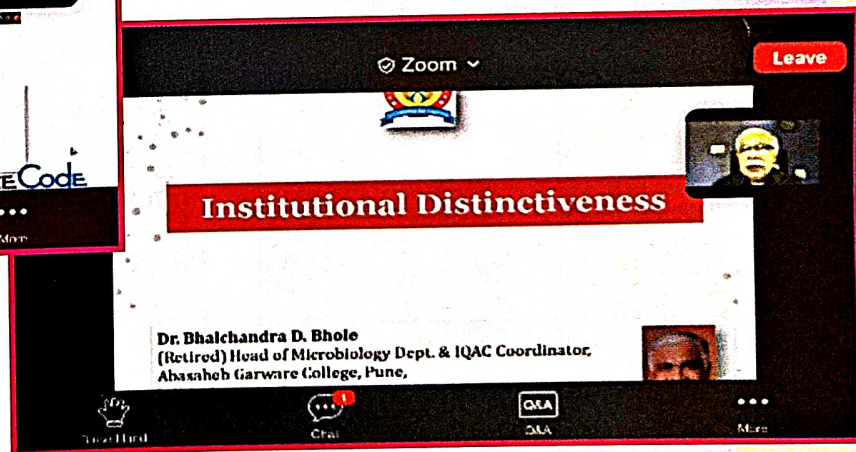
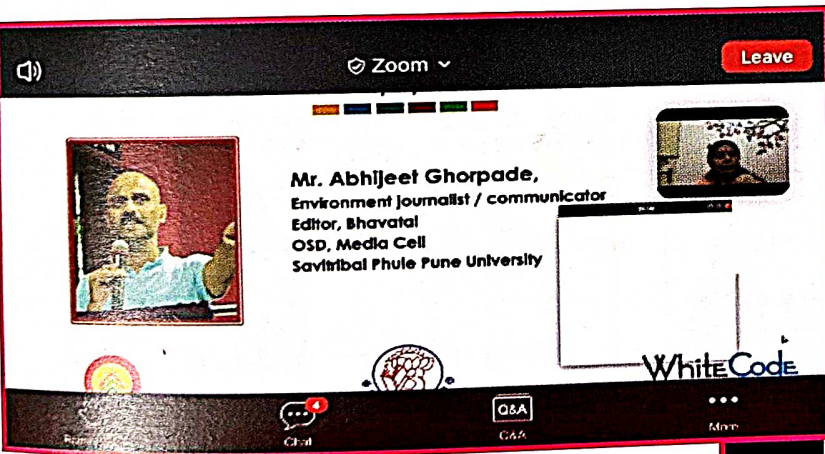

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell of the college has been conscious of its role of being a catalyst "To improve the academic and administrative performance of the institution." Keeping the five core values recommended by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) and the seven criteria for assessment under Quality Indicator Framework, the IQAC continuously works towards the sustainability of excellence at various levels in the institution. With the help of NAAC Support Committee, the IQAC strategically worked out plans in coordination with the Departments and Committees for the academic year 2022-2023.

1. One major change for the academic level was introduction of Academic Data Management System (ADMS). It was designed by Dr. Twinkle Sanghavi and Dr. Anuja Deshpande under the leadership of Principal Dr. Rajshree Trivedi. This software will help the college data to come on one platform and can be viewed from anywhere at any time.
2. To maintain the quality in academics, every year IQAC conducts Academic Audit. This year it was inter department academic audit.
3. Under Career Advancement Scheme IQAC successfully completed the promotion process of 4 teachers and one librarian.

The following initiatives were also undertaken:

## 1. Curriculum Aspects:

Most departments planned and conducted an Add-on Course for the final year students; whereas for first years the IQAC planned MOOC courses for all students and it included Fundamentals of Computers, use of Internet, and social media. For Second Year students, an Advance Excel Course was organized by the college. Both these courses were free for the students.

## 2. Teaching – Learning & Evaluation:

- Teachers used their own Learning Management System effectively.
- Under the MOU's signed by the Departments, various Programs were organized. They included Faculty and Student Exchange, webinars, workshops, conferences, interactive sessions and other activities.
- Mentoring services for students were further systemized.
- Three teachers, Dr. Twinkle Sanghavi, Dr. Anuja Deshpande, and Ms. Neha Bhansali attended Faculty development program on new Teaching Pedagogy Two departments, in rotation every year, are trained by an external researcher in the process of research. The project began with Psychology and Sociology, under the guidance of the director, Dr. S.M. Michael, Institute of Indian Culture (IIC, Mumbai).

## 3. Research, Innovations and Extension:

- Smt. Kantaben Shah Research Centre for Multidisciplinary Studies, Short term research projects have been granted to 3 faculty members.
- Two faculty members of Department of Psychology Dr. Cicilia Chettiar and Dr. Anuja Deshpande jointly edited the book "Unmasking the Future A Collection of Scholarly Essays on the Impact and aftermath of the Covid- 19 Crisis." Many of the teachers of the institute have contributed to the book.



- Two Teachers published their papers in UGC approved journals whereas 11 papers were published in Peer reviewed journals.
- 2 Teachers published their chapters in books related to their subjects.
- Student Aid for Research (S.T.A.R.): In order to train interested undergraduate students in research, KSRC initiated a program titled Student Aid for Research (S.T.A.R.). Ms. Veronica Pinto served as the research coordinator. Students completed two projects which were presented by them as a research study.

The following year, the departments of B.Com and B.A. (Economics) were selected for participation. They were guided by Dr. Vinod Kamble and their department faculty served as research co-ordinators. Dr. Rekha Kaklotar, Dr. Rita Chandrana and Ms. Pranaya Revandkar provided the students with much needed support through their research journey. This year students participated in the research paper competition where they stood third with their research work, attracting a cash prize of Rs. 2,000/-
