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# Report on GENDERLOGUE: Gender Lens on COVID - 19 Crises

Maniben Nanavati Women's College conducted two virtual events. They were:

1. A Panel Discussion on Social Solidarity in the Contemporary Times on 7<sup>th</sup> August, 2020. 320 participants attended the event.

# a. Objectives:

- To share with participants the experiences of frontline activists and worked at the community kitchens, relief aid camps and affected areas
- To sensitize students to the challenges that the frontline workforce faces during COVID – 19 crisis.
- To make the students realize their contributory roles as responsible citizens of country

### b. Outcomes:

- The presentation of all the three speakers left an insightful impression on the participants. An urge to inquire more about the real experiences of the speakers was seen in the Chatbox filled with questions.
- A few important questions that came up that were related to COVID -19 casualties and patients, nutrition, health care, mental health, online learning and related issues, migration of labour and economic crisis.
- The term "Social Distancing" to be replaced with terms such as "Physical Distancing" and "Social Solidarity."
- A realization by all the 320 participants that the humans will have to learn to live with COVID – 19 and extend solidarity and cooperation to one another in these adverse times.
- **c. Future Plans:** A follow up of panel discussion in the month of January 2021 to review the "new normal "situation in the post- COVID 19 times.
- 2. A Short Film Making Competition "Capturing COVID -19 Crisis on Celluloid" on 13th August, 2020. 21 entries were received. Each entry had a group of 4 students. The event was attended by 450 participants.


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
- To encourage today's techno-savvy young generation to respond to the present crisis using the digitally-governed audio visual modes

**Aim of the event:** Introducing Satrangi, raising awareness about the community and mental health, introspection and expanding team Satrangi.

For the month of July instead of having an external guest/personality, team Satrangi decided to take the front stage and planned the event of this month to introduce the cell to the other departments of Maniben Nanavati women's college.

A four day-long game evening event was in motion. The games were a mix of LGBTQA+ and mental health, using games as a means of generating awareness and introducing the purpose and the importance of the cell to the students.

Purpose of the activity: Now what was the point of this activity? One key factor that contributes to the mental health hampering of the individuals belonging to the community is not being treated with respect. Not being treated equally. A way of changing that is by using the correct word in regards to the gender they identify with. A simple way of Orienting yourselves with that is simply by asking. The way we ask someone what their name is, we also ask them what they identify as. As long as we're open to learning and accepting we know we're headed in the right direction. Something like supporting small transgender businesses and promoting them or showing your support in anyway possible, like even attending this session and then hopefully registering yourselves to become a member is a way of showing support and is appreciated way more than you'll know.

#### What do you do if?

#### **Objective:**

- 1. Spread Awareness
- 2. Individual exploration on the topic

Time allotted: 15 mins

- 1. If you pass a hijra, how will you feel?
- 2. You are in a party and you meet a person who is on a big position and you have a fun time with that person but later you find out that, that person is bisexual, will your perception change?
- 3. Your friend mentions a restaurant about its ambience, it's food and service and you are very excited to go there, then you research about it, its menu and everything and found out that this restaurant's owner is a hijra, will you go there?
- 4. A new colleague is appointed but that colleague is transgender will you be able to give that person a warm welcome?
- 5. Your best friend is gay and one day she comes out to you, will you look at her the same way you did before she came out?
- 6. If you see a homosexual couple, will you feel disgusted or happy?

**Purpose of the activity:** What we did here right now is introspect. Coming to terms with how self aware we truly are. Before fixing the system comes the step of knowing where we stand. Where our mindsets stand. Hope this activity gave you a deeper insight on what your next move should be in order to contribute to the welfare of the lgbtq+ community. And an even deeper Insight of ourselves as human beings.

#### **Functioning and division of batches:**

- Volunteers in pairs of two would conduct sessions at the same time.
- Roughly 4-5 sessions a day were conducted from 6:30pm to 7:30pm.
- Two volunteers would take one class of a particular dept. at a time consisting of close to 40 students.

• Attendance was maintained.

#### Flow of the event:

- The event started with an activity on 'mentimeter' where the audience members were asked to write the first thought that comes to their mind when they see the words-LGBT+ and Mental health as a means of breaking ice.
- An introduction to Satrangi was given.
- The first game- 'put your finger down if..' was played followed by the message of the game's purpose.
- The second game- 'what would you do if..' was played followed by the message of its purpose.
- Concluding the session was a brief talk from team Satrangi about why one should be a part of the cell.
- Links to the feedback form and registration forms for joining team Satrangi were left in the session and sent to the respective class representatives as well.

#### **Outcome:**

- An online activity of 20+ additions to the Instagram handle of Satrangi was seen.
- Feedback was received from over 80 students.
- 78 registrations were observed.







#### 1.1. History of the College

Maniben Nanavati Women's College is the dream child of two dynamic and farsighted women – late Smt. Kantaben Shah (1916-1981) and late Smt. Sunitaben Sheth (1924-2012), the erstwhile Chairperson of the Managing Committee. Both of them hailed from aristocratic Guajarati business families fully devoted to the cause of welfare and upliftment of the community in their immediate surroundings. As active members of the Bhagini Seva Mandir Kumarika Stree Mandal (BSMKSM), Vile Parle –West, Mumbai, both of them kept up to the main mission of the Mandal- the welfare and empowerment of women. The foundation stone of the BSMKSM was laid by Mahatma Gandhi, the beloved Bapu. Following the footsteps of Gandhiji's efforts in educating and empowering women, they started the Nootan Mahila College in 1972 under the aegis of BSMKSM with a small number of 110 students. In 1978, Shree Chandulal Nanavati Women's Institute and Girls' High School, an educational trust took over the administration of the College and rechristened it with the present name.

With the introduction of the 10-2-3 education system, a junior college was started in June 1976. It was named Tapiben Chhaganlal Lalji Valia Junior College in June 1979. The same year, the College received permanent affiliation from the SNDT Women's University, Mumbai. The college remains affiliated to same University till date.

### 1.6. Audit Methodology

Methodology is structured and is an approach used to collect, analyze, and interpret quantitative and qualitative data to answer gender-sensitive questions. It is a process to promote gender equality, equal opportunities, and open-mindedness and to identify gender bias behaviours. The methodology involves as follows:

**Audit Team-** An Audit team was set up to identify objectives, scope, purpose, and plan of action. Accordingly, members of the Women Development Cell were allotted work to achieve objectives.

**Survey form -** The team drafted a questionnaire related to gender terminologies and sensitization, and a form was created through a Google link. Data was collected via survey answers from students and teachers.

**Analysis -** Post-data collection, was analyzed to identify any gender-based inequalities or biased behaviours within an organization. Various policies followed by the organization but unknown to students and teachers could be brought to realization through this survey.

**Conclusions-** The analysis and findings of the survey, and gender audit are added in the later chapter in the report.



















### • Security and Gardening

### 3.4. Special Projects

### 1. RAAH- Apki Raah humari Manzil



RAAH is a digital platform that was initiated by the Department Of Child Development, Maniben Nanavati Women's College for the transgender community and their Parents in the year 2019-20. This was the student-led research Project represented at Avishkar & Anveshan- prestigious student research conventions (State, zonal, and national level) and begged prizes. Its Vision is to To E.A.S.E. (E – Empathize A – Accept S – Sensitize E – Empower) parents towards gender identity. Its Mission is To integrate transgender people into mainstream society; To empower and educate parents of transgender children; and To increase awareness among society about transgender individuals. Since then, the student team and their Mentor Dr. Swati Partani have been working to benefit the Transgender community in many ways. Raah has covered numerous events which have helped us succeed in our mission bringing us closer to our vision. Live events like "Azadi ke Lafz", "Kavach Clothes Distribution Drive, and Distribution Drives (Distribution of nutritional kits & hygiene kits to HIV Trans patients)" and videos to prepare immunity booster recipes amidst complete lockdown in collaboration with generous organizations were conducted. Insightful webinars like - "Beyond Gender: Unmasking Gender Norms", "Trans-Jan: A conversation with the members of the Transgender community." and the three webinars held in collaboration with Volunteer for India "ECLIPSING GENDER: A Step towards "Trans" informing Gender Norms", "DECODING GENDER (Hint: It isn't binary)" and "Gender Affirming Surgical Interventions" aimed towards parents, teenagers, and transgender individuals respectively were also held.

In the academic year 2022-23, RAAH collaborated with the Tweet Foundation to benefit the Transgender individuals sheltered at Garima Greh. They were provided intensive 4 months of training in Digital Literacy and English Language Literacy to make them employment-ready. Most of them were absorbed in jobs post-training. Laptops were donated to Garima Greh. This program was launched on 4th August- December 2022 in collaboration with the Rotary Club of Bombay Airport, Garima Greh adopted by Tweet Foundation.

**Laptop Distribution Drive** - Team RAAH along with the Rotary Club of Bombay Airport conducted a laptop distribution drive on Tuesday, 13th October 2022, wherein 13 laptops were donated to the residents of Garima Greh to support the Skill Development Program under Project RAAH.

**Bambai Nazariya Visit -** 5 Students of Team Raah visited Bambai Nazariya on Wednesday, 28th December 2022 to interview & gain insight into the professional & personal life of the transgender employees running the cafe.

**Panel Discussion with Tweet Foundation -** Dr. Swati Partani in collaboration with Tweet Foundation had a panel discussion with Mr. Akshay Tyagi on Trans Education & Employment on Thursday, 18th August 2022

**Panel Discussion with Girl Up Delhi Coalition -** Dr. Swati Partani along with 2 students of Team RAAH in collaboration with the Girl Up Delhi Coalition had a panel discussion on Friday, 6th January 2023 via Instagram live on the contribution of Raah towards the transgender community

**Interview with Mahi** - Dr. Swati Partani along with 7 students of Team RAAH interviewed Mahi on 18th February 2023 to gain an insight into her personal life & an in-depth understanding of her struggles as well as those of the Transgender community.

Certificate Distribution & Closing Ceremony - A Certificate Distribution was held on Saturday, 8th April 2023, in collaboration with the Rotary Club of Bombay Airport to culminate the Skill Development Program & felicitate the residents of Garima Greh and RAAH alumni.













#### 2. SATRANGI HAQ SE!

Satrangi is a student-run program that has a mandate of creating a safe space for students facing a gender identity crisis. Students who require such support are identified by Satrangi volunteers, who are primarily SYBA Psychology students. It focuses on issues of gender dysphoria and sexual orientation. Due to the nature of the crisis, the counselor is usually involved and sometimes specific teachers are involved as needed.

#### **GOALS:**

- 1. To be able to bring about equality and improve the emotional rights situation of LGBTQ+ people in MNWC.
- 2. To be able to provide opportunities for girls to engage in making MNWC a place where everyone, regardless of their sexual orientation or gender identity, can live free from hatred, prejudice, and discrimination.
- 3. To be inclusive and open in our work to challenge discrimination and to consult, involve, and inform the individuals and the communities we serve.
- 4. To create a safe emotional space for all regardless of their sexual orientation.
- 5. To work on the holistic well-being of our mates in MNWC.



#### 2019-2020

The Satrangi Cell was inaugurated during the International Women's Day Celebration in 2020. The TYBA Psychology students expressed a need to create a safe space for discussions centering around gender identity, sexual orientation, and related issues.

An online event was conducted on 12th September 2020, where Ms. Palak Shah, the Founder of Paddling Foundation, spoke about their work as a non-profit, gender-inclusive *Gender Audit Report 2018-2023* 

platform, fighting period poverty and stigmas. The aim was to make gender-based issues open and comfortable for discussion. Students maintained an ongoing conversation among themselves without involving faculty too intensely to maintain confidentiality and prevent prejudice and stigma.


#### 2020-2021

On 26th June 2021, the Satrangi!Haq Se cell coordinated with the Rotaract Club of Unitech and conducted an online discussion titled "Live with PRIDE"- LGBTQ MYTHS AND FACTS by Samuel (Shyam) Konnar.





20<sup>th</sup> July 2020 Satrangi was launched online with its own Instagram profile. Students focused on making regular posts related to LGBTQ+ concerns and the pride movement. A system of involving second-year students in the organizing of online events and maintaining the Instagram profile of the cell was established. Guidance was received from department teachers





An online webinar with stand-up comedian Aayushi Jagad on her journey as a celebrity who produced queer-inclusive content and created awareness on LGBTQ+ issues. The month of October saw a series of online activities conducted between 26<sup>th</sup> October '20 - and 29<sup>th</sup> October '20. The event aimed to introduce Satrangi to the rest of the college students, raise awareness about the community and mental health, and provide a space for introspection to the expanding team Satrangi. A four-day-long

game evening event was set in motion. The games were a mix of LGBTQA+ and mental health, using games as a means of generating awareness and introducing the purpose and the importance of the cell to the students. More and more students were stepping up to speak to Satrangi volunteers through online spaces and for confidentiality, no photographs or names were disclosed.

#### 2021-2022

The Satrangi Cell in collaboration with the Women's Development Cell organised a short film screening on 26th February 2022. An enthusiastic participant 87 had registered and 89 participants were present on the day to contribute to the discussion. It started with a piece of brief information about what Satrangi is and carried with movie screen sharing named, "**Pretend**". Discussions included the topics of how parents and children's roles are important to understand the conflicts of the LGTBQ + Community and how safe spaces like Satrangi are essential in times of prejudice and unhealthy norms.







#### 2022-2023

For the year 2022-23, a yearlong campaign was carried out by the students. It began with an online celebration of World Pride Day on 28/6/22. Mr. Argha Naskar and Mr. Praful Baweja conducted an interactive session on the specific challenges faced by the LGBTQIA+ community in the space of entrepreneurship. 20 in-house students and 27 community members participated in this online session that was conducted in collaboration with NIEDIC.

From August 2022 to March 2023, the students maintained the Instagram profile of Satrangi and kept posting relevant posts. The number of followers has increased showing more student participation in these conversations.

On International Women's Day, students performed a dance drama on the eternal love story of Radha Krishna adding a modern spin. The drama raised the issue of societal conformity for love across the ages irrespective of gender orientation of the couples involved.

# 4.2.1. Teachers Gender Audit Survey Analysis:






Figure 4.1.13





Figure 4.1.14




Figure 4.1.16




Figure 4.1.17




Figure 4.1. 18





Figure 4.1.19





Figure 4.1.21




figure 4.2.11




figure 4.2.12




Figure 4.2.13






Figure 4.2.14




Figure 4.2.17




Figure 4.2.17




Figure 4.2.17




Figure 4.2.18




Figure 4.2.19

#### **5.** Key Observations from the Survey

- 1. Discussion related to gender sensitization: As per the survey, teachers and students are open about gender-related terms and discuss related issues. Yet, more awareness about the various terms related to gender and its concept is needed through sessions, activities, and lectures.
- 2. Mentoring sessions of the teachers and the students: Teachers can take counseling sessions regarding gender sensitization, imparting appropriate knowledge, and encouraging students to openly speak about any doubts, concerns, opinions, or other issues.
- 3. Gender awareness activities: The college has the Women Development Cell, which has activities and workshops about women's encouragement but also other genders i.e., Genderlogue. It organizes various sessions, talks, conferences, outreach activities, etc. for students, teachers, and non-teaching members.
- 4. Gender Sensitization and Awareness Sessions for Parents: one or two sessions were arranged for parents and in the audit survey many students preferred talking to their parents to discuss or raise their issues related to gender-based violence, equality, etc. Hence, working towards gender sensitization and equality in the organization, to educate parents about gender issues, rights, terms, problems, or behavior handling training sessions, workshops, and seminars should be arranged by the Women Development Cell.
- 5. Awareness among all: gender sensitization workshops should be a part of the staff induction program and should be organized twice a year, including evaluation and feedback.
- 6. A separate washroom facility for the transgender community or a common washroom for all.
- 7. Some other observations from the gender survey are as follows:
  - i. Admission to transgender.
  - ii. Usage of appropriate language, gender sensitivity programs, and workplace etiquette must be taught.
  - iii. Awareness Campaign, and sensitization session for staff and students.
  - iv. Projects to teach defense to students and staff, like constitutional rights, physical defense, how to register complaints, etc.
- 8. The scope of the program can be increased by including the following topics and discussion:
  - a. Sensitization about the plurality of gender
  - b. Gender Inequality
  - c. Masculinity and femininity
  - d. Role of Gender Equality in Sustainable development
  - e. Gender fluid and gender non-binary

#### Report on Genderlogue 2022-2023

"Women In Sports: Opportunities and Challenges"

#### 23/08/2022

The Women Development Cell (WDC) and the Internal Complaint Committee (ICC) of Maniben Nanavati Women's College (MNWC), Vile Parle, organised the Panel Discussion and Play performance as part of the GENDERLOGUE series, in collaboration with the Freidrich Ebert Stiftung (FES). 7 male participants and 204 female participants attended the panel discussions from MNWC and other colleges in Mumbai. The topic of the panel discussion was "Women In Sports: Opportunities and Challenges" as part of the "Getting Foothold In the Public Space" theme for the Genderlogue series, Mumbai. The event began with the singing of the MNWC college song followed by a welcome speech and felicitation by the Principal, Dr. Rajshree Trivedi. Next, the role of FES in sponsoring the Genderlogue series and its success over the years was narrated by Ms. Jyoti Rawal from FES, India. Prof. Vibhuti Patel explained the concept of the Genderlogue and its purpose.

Prof. Vibhuti Patel moderated this panel along with Dr. Lata Pujari, Prof. Bino Paul, Mr. Mihir Vasavda and Ms. Varsha Nagre as the panelist. The discussion began with Prof. Paul exploring sexism and the obvious gaps in the arena of sports. Moving on to Dr. Lata Pujari, who elaborated on her personal experience as an athlete and captivated the audience with the revelation of the pre-game and post-game struggles female athletes face with their families. Mr. Mihir Vasavda reported on the years of discrimination these women go through in the process of becoming an athlete. He explained the hierarchy that is unjustly in place, denying the opportunity for a woman to become a Coach and is instead, forced to stick with becoming a Manager, leaving them to play the role of just a guardian. Toward the end, Ms. Varsha Nagre, a match referee herself, talked about her struggles of clearing the examination for becoming an umpire, narrating the doubts and ill-treatment she received from her male colleagues questioning her judgement regarding the decisions during the Game. The panel discussion

proceeded to a brief Q&A session between the panelist and the students, where they captivated the audience with their insightful answers. The first session of the day ended with a vote of thanks speech by Ms. Sheetal Salve.

The second half of the Genderlogue event was followed by the staging of the play "Mard ko Dard Hota Hai" by the Men Against Violence & Abuse (MAVA) theatre group. 10 male participants and 250 female participants attended the play performance. It began with the introduction of MAVA by Ms. Shirin Plasterwala and was followed by an overview of the concept of the play by Mr. Rohit Thappa, himself. Mr. Thappa and his team were felicitated by the Principal, Dr. Rajshree Trivedi and the stage was then given away to the actors for the performance. The tragic-comic nature of the play was a scathing commentary on the victimization of all genders, and not just men and women. The portrayal of the challenges faced by men as a result of the gender roles prescribed by the social system of patriarchy provided the students with an alternative perspective on the issues of gender. After the end of the play, Ms. Aaliya Sayed concluded the second session, and thereby the Genderlogue event with a vote of thanks speech.

#### "ROADS, MALL AND BEYOND: WALKING WITHOUT FEAR"

#### 12th December 2022

The Women Development Cell (WDC) and the Internal Complaint Committee (ICC) of Maniben Nanavati Women's College (MNWC), Vile Parle, organized the Dance-Drama Performance and Intercollegiate Essay Writing and Self-Written Poetry Recitation Competition as part of the GENDERLOGUE series, in collaboration with the Freidrich Ebert Stiftung (FES). 3 male participants and 244 female participants attended the event from MNWC and other colleges in Mumbai. The theme of this event was "ROADS, MALL AND BEYOND: WALKING WITHOUT FEAR" as part of the "Getting Foothold In the Public Space" theme for the Genderlogue series, Mumbai. The event began with Ms. Geeta Varun, Incharge of the WDC welcoming the guest and the singing of the MNWC college song. This was followed by a welcome speech and felicitation by the Vice Principal. Dr. Rita Patil. Next, Dr. Rita Patil explained the importance of the Genderlogue and its purpose.

The introduction of the Chief Guest, Dr. Shilpa Phadke was done by the Co-Incharge of WDC, Ms. Aaliya sayed. Following which Dr. Phadke took the stage and mesmerized the audience with her enigmatic speech. She spoke about the difference between the space of a mall and *Gender Audit Report 2018-2023* 

roads in context to women and their safety and added that most violence against women takes place at home. She elaborated at length about the antagonism between the spaces that are 'allowed' for women in the name of freedom and empowerment which are often riddled with double standards and limitations of their own. For the most part, Dr. Phadke explained the hint of patriarchal privilege in the act of "loitering" following which she quoted, "Loitering is fun and is an act of citizenship". She ended her speech by motivating the young audience to claim the public places and the act of loitering. The speech was followed by a brief Q&A session between Dr. Shilpa Phadke and the Participants present in the audience, where she captivated the audience with her insightful answers. The next part of the first session was a beautiful Dance-Drama performance by the students of MNWC, Choreographed, Composed and Directed by Mrs. Jhelum Paranjape and team. The first session of the day ended with a vote of thanks speech by Ms. Sheetal Salve.

Ms. Aaliya Sayed welcomed the participants for the second session of Dance-Drama Performance and Intercollegiate Essay Writing and Self-Written Poetry Recitation Competition. Ms. Pravara Sonawane introduced the Judges for the Self-Written Poetry Recitation Competition, Adv. Gauri Chhabria and Mrs. Manisha Vesvikar. **OBJECTIVES:** To initiate a discussion on gender discrimination faced by Women Athletes in various institutions and to familiarise the students with the challenges and struggles faced by women in sports.

**METHODOLOGY:** Panel discussion and Play Performance

**OVERVIEW:** The Women Development Cell (WDC) and the Internal Complaint Committee (ICC) of Maniben Nanavati Women's College (MNWC), Vile Parle, organised the Panel Discussion and Play performance as part of the GENDERLOGUE series, in collaboration with the Freidrich Ebert Stiftung (FES). 7 male participants and 204 female participants attended the panel discussions from MNWC and other colleges in Mumbai. The topic of the panel discussion was "Women In Sports: Opportunities and Challenges" as part of the "Getting Foothold In the Public Space" theme for the Genderlogue series, Mumbai. The event began with the singing of the MNWC college song followed by a welcome speech and felicitation by the Principal, Dr. Rajshree Trivedi. Next, the role of FES in sponsoring the Genderlogue series and its success over the years was narrated by Ms. Jyoti Rawal from FES, India. Prof. Vibhuti Patel explained the concept of the Genderlogue and its purpose.

Prof. Vibhuti Patel moderated this panel along with Dr. Lata Pujari, Prof. Bino Paul, Mr. Mihir Vasavda and Ms. Varsha Nagre as the panelist. The discussion began with Prof. Paul exploring sexism and the obvious gaps in the arena of sports. Moving on to Dr. Lata Pujari, who elaborated on her personal experience as an athlete and captivated the audience with the revelation of the pre-game and post-game struggles female athletes face with their families. Mr. Mihir Vasavda reported on the years of discrimination these women go through in the process of becoming an athlete. He explained the hierarchy that is unjustly in place, denying the opportunity for a woman

to become a Coach and is instead, forced to stick with becoming a Manager, leaving them to play the role of just a guardian. Toward the end, Ms. Varsha Nagre, a match referee herself, talked about her struggles of clearing the examination for becoming an umpire, narrating the doubts and ill-treatment she received from her male colleagues questioning her judgement regarding the decisions during the Game. The panel discussion proceeded to a brief Q&A session between the panelist and the students, where they captivated the audience with their insightful answers. The first session of the day ended with a vote of thanks speech by Ms. Sheetal Salve.

The second half of the Genderlogue event was followed by the staging of the play "Mard ko Dard Hota Hai" by the Men Against Violence & Abuse (MAVA) theatre group. 10 male participants and 250 female participants attended the play performance. It began with the introduction of MAVA by Ms. Shirin Plasterwala and was followed by an overview of the concept of the play by Mr. Rohit Thappa, himself. Mr. Thappa and his team were felicitated by the Principal, Dr. Rajshree Trivedi and the stage was then given away to the actors for the performance. The tragic-comic nature of the play was a scathing commentary on the victimization of all genders, and not just men and women. The portrayal of the challenges faced by men as a result of the gender roles prescribed by the social system of patriarchy provided the students with an alternative perspective on the issues of gender. After the end of the play, Ms. Aaliya Sayed concluded the second session, and thereby the Genderlogue event with a vote of thanks speech.

**OUTCOME:** The panellists captivated the students with the spectrum of challenges faced by women in sports like the lack of Menstrual health and Financial support, Social disrespect and gendered prejudice, discriminatory practices of the Sex tests and so on. Students and guests were made aware of such unheard-gendered aspects of sports through insightful discussions among the panelist. Later, the students were mesmerized by the performance of the play and the social message it conveyed carved a little path in the direction of social change.
