


METHODOLOGY: Participative

OVERVIEW: The talk on Inclusion was conducted by the Child Development Department of Maniben Nanavati Women's College on 03 December, 2020 at 11:45 A.M. The talk was conducted for the undergraduate students. It was organized in honor of the International Disabled Persons Day celebrated on the same day. The session commenced with a poem recited by Ms. Belita D'souza a student of TYBA. It was titled "I'm Not Special, I'm Just like You". Following which, was a brief introduction of the guest speaker -Ms. Manjushree Patil. She went on to introduce Aatman Academy, a school created by her and her team for students with all kinds of disabilities. It is a place where one co-creates learning using innovative and creative methods to overcome and manage challenges. Ms. Patil started off with showing the participants various assortments of fruits in different forms, colors, shapes, sizes and of varied types. She went on to associate this with the different and diverse individuals we see in our everyday lives and that is what makes us unique. She placed a large emphasis on looking beyond a person's disability and


instead recognizing them for their contribution and most importantly viewing them as a whole. In order for the participants to truly understand inclusion, Ms. Patil screened two short films on inclusion and exclusion. The first was, CGI 3D Animated Short: "Ian" - by Mundoloco CGI I am Foundation presented by The CGBros. The message of the short film was. to understand inclusion; we must use empathy and recall instances when we were excluded. The next film was Purl by Pixar, Spark Shorts. The film relayed a message of trying to fit in when discriminated against. With great vigour, the speaker urged the participants to look beyond inclusion, and aim to create a space and sense of belonging. Ms. Patil says, "We need to shift the paradigm, from disability to diversity, from problem to panorama." She put a great emphasis on teaching diversity and the importance of radical and unconditional acceptance. The speaker went on to recite a poem she had penned a few years ago. She shares with the participants her utopian dream- "I wish one day we won't need inclusion anymore, we will all just be and that day the work will be done". Following this was another poem recitation titled "Main alag hu" by Ms. Kajal Jaiswal, student of SYBA, followed by a question and answer session. The speaker addressed questions relating to an inclusive curriculum, challenges faced, teaching during covid, etc. The session concluded with a formal vote of thanks by student Ms. Raajalakshmi Iyer and the HOD of the Child Development Department Dr. Swati Partani and the participants sharing their sincere gratitude to Ms. Manjushree Patil.

- 3. Breakout Rooms Activity
- Alternate Supremacy {Physically Disabled}
- Blind Doodle {Visual impairment}
- Whisper Challenged { Auditory impairment}
- Swap Scan { Learning Disability}
- 4. Quiz Time

OVERVIEW: The department of Child Development conducted an event in collaboration with Divyangjan Cell- An IQAC Initiative to celebrate disability day with the students of Maniben Nanavati Women's College. The event began with a warm welcome of the participants, followed by a brief introduction given by the narrator. A short Ice-breaker activity {See What You See} was played with the participants in 4 different rounds where they were asked to say the colour of the word as fast as they can and not what the word is. An Orientation about what is disability, its significance and their major types [physical, visual, hearing, & learning disability] was explained through ppt. Then students were placed in three different breakout rooms, where many interesting games were arranged for them.

Breakout Rooms Activities: -

- 1. Alternate Supremacy [Physically disability]
- Participants had to write two phrases as quickly as they could with their non-dominant hand; there was a set time of 30 seconds within.
- 2. Blind Doodle [Visual impairment]
- Images were shown to participants for 5 seconds.
- They had to close their eyes &
- Draw the showed images on a sheet of paper [blindfolded]
- 3. Whisper Challenged [Auditory impairment]
- One player was the Receiver; the other player was the Whisperer.
- The Whisperer [instructor] chooses a phrase or quote that the Receiver [participants] is likely to know.
- The participants needed to understand the lip- sync and guess the correct answer, while the MIC was on mute with the instructor and camera was on.
- 4. Swap Scan [Learning disability]
- Sentences was given in a reverse/ scramble order
- Participants had to read the sentences with correct pronunciation of words.

After playing these games, participants were brought back to the main room where they were asked about their experiences and what challenges they faced while playing.

The later part of the event was followed by Quiz Time in which basic general questions about disability were displayed on screen and the students were asked to answer the correct option in the chat box.

In the end of the event, Oath was taken by everyone present in the meeting saying that "We will focus on Able, not on Label"

OUTCOME:

The Disability Day event was one of its kind and a huge success on a whole level. Activities were very short and simple. The students were very enthusiastic and every activity carried

It was liked and enjoyed by everyone. They were very eager to answer in many activities like 'Swap Scan'. In 'Blind Doodle' they drew some fun but cute drawings. Whisper Challenges were enjoyable too. Students were helping each other to get the right answer. In the end, there was a brief talk about how it's not easy for people with disabilities and how stressful life gets for them even in day to day life. It was a fun yet knowledgeable session.





Project Akshaya (The Nutritional Breakfast Scheme) IQAC and FN Dept

Overview:

Frequent cases of students displaying weakness, feebleness, headaches, anemic tendencies and menstrual problems, at times resulting into fainting and fever have been observed and recorded by the medical doctor on the campus. The IQAC in collaboration with the Department of Food & Nutrition realized the need to start a free nutritional breakfast scheme for the students from needy sections. Project AKSHAYA was the outcome of this realization.

Project Akshaya:

Project Akshaya was launched on 8th July 2020 by the College to cater to the nutritional needs of students. The main objective of the project is to provide a healthy breakfast to the needy students. Out of the total strength of the college, the Departments were requested to identify at least 5 students from their classes and hand over the names to the Vice Principal Dr. Rita Patil who is also the Head of the Department of Food & Nutrition.

The Department of Food & Nutrition prepared a breakfast plan which comprises of nutritional snacks such as Pohe, boiled chana, bananas, roasted grams and peanuts, chikkis, and Sattu drink. It was decided that the students could pick up their breakfast at 9.30 from the second floor near the lift. Mrs. Vandana Keni, the Lab Assistant is given the responsibility to arrange for distributing the breakfast items. Apart from the daily breakfast, students are provided nutritional snacks on a few occasions such as workshops, training programmes or sports events

Fund Allocation:

The fund for the project is allocated by the Management of the college under the Student-welfare head. A few regular donors such as Inner Wheel Club of Bombay West and Inner Wheel Club of Bombay Airport have shown a keen interest in supporting the project.







She then justified the absence of a civil court system in India, as there is an absence of a Uniform Civil Code throughout the nation. This absence forces the law to discriminate against the rights of women, according to the religion they belong to. The rights of women belonging to their personal religion were revealed.


The latest cases of the supreme court latest as of 28th January 2022, were read out to the students.



languages respectively, Hindi and English and asked the participants to repeat the oath after her.



His vision was to educate all through learning by doing and self-reliance is very important today..

We should always promote peace and stop violence and UN should play a big role and children should be taught Gandhiji's values and ideology from childhood as they are very important in today's time and therefore it's important to spread his ideas and message which can help us to solve current problems and issues peacefully and read a poem to indicate the 21st century problems and thanked all the students and dignitaries present.

He released the book officially and thanked all who contributed in this book and spreading the message and values of Gandhiji.

Principal Madam thanked him for his motivational talk and Book Release and also thanked Editor, Dr. Rita Patil along with Dr. Sejal Shah and the entire GSC team.
