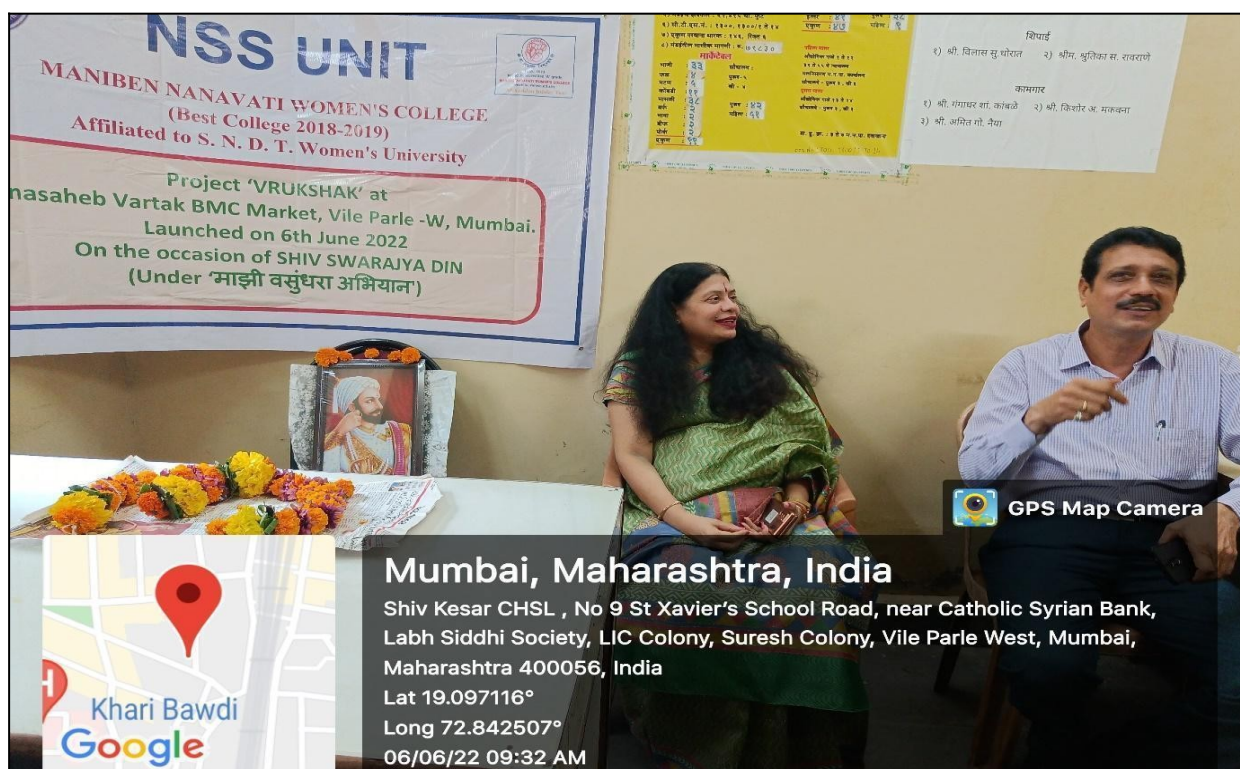

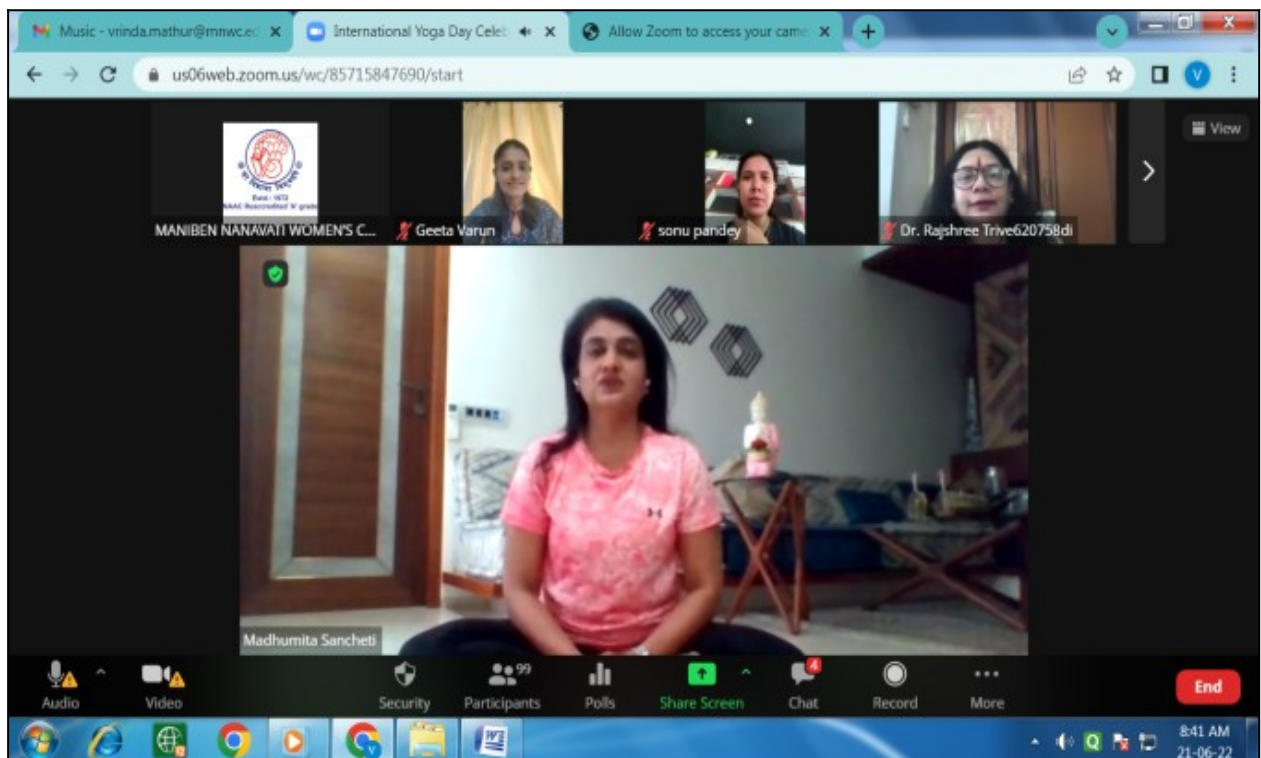
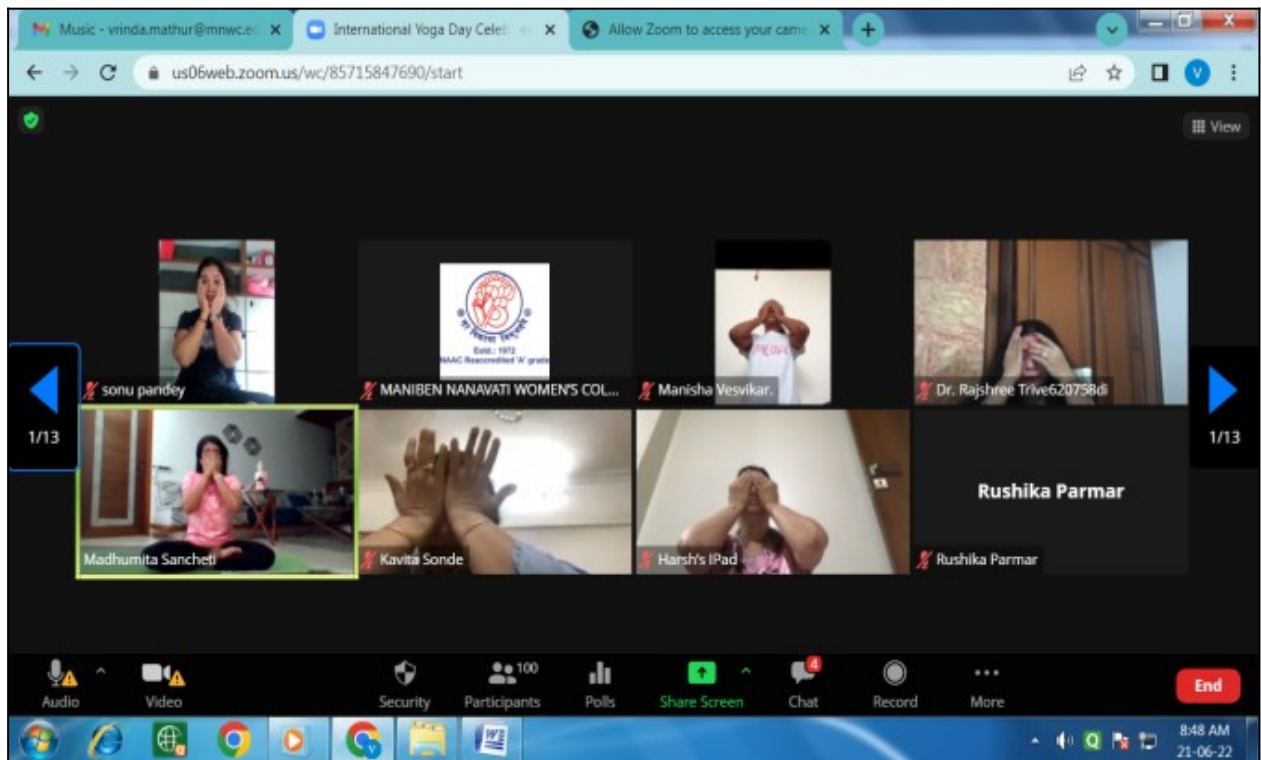
METHODOLOGY : Experiential.

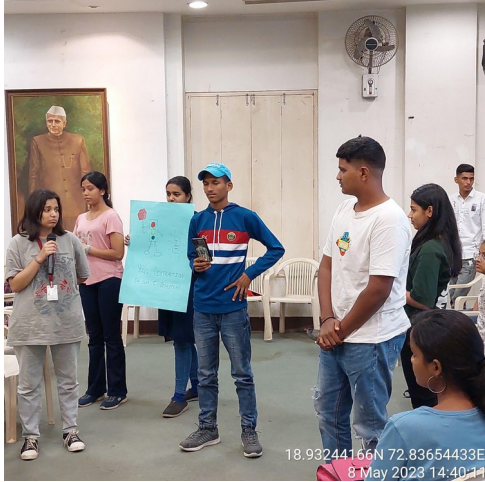
OBJECTIVES To engage the students, teachers and the community in the practice of blood donation.
