It's **Vision** is to To E.A.S.E. (E – Empathize A – Accept S – Sensitize E – Empower) parents towards gender identity. It's **Mission** is To integrate transgender people into the mainstream society; To empower and educate parents of transgender children; To increase awareness among society about transgender individuals. Since then the student team along with their Mentor Dr Swati Partani are working to benefit Transggender community in multitude ways. Raah has covered numerous events which have helped us succeed in our mission bringing us closer to our vision. Live events like Azadi ke Lafz, Kavach Clothes Distribution Drive, and Distribution Drives (Distribution of nutritional kits & hygiene kits to HIV Trans patients) & Videos to prepare immunity booster recipes admist complete lockdown in collaboration with generous organizations were conducted. Insightful webinars like - "Beyond Gender: Unmasking Gender Norms", "Trans-Jan: A conversation with the members of the Transgender community." and the three webinars held in collaboration with Volunteer for India ECLIPSING GENDER: A Step towards "Trans" informing Gender Norms, DECODING GENDER (Hint: It isn't binary) and Gender Affirming Surgical Interventions aimed towards parents, teenagers and transgender individuals respectively were also held.

In the academic year 2022-23, RAAH collaborated with Tweet Foundation to benefit the Transgender individuals sheltered at Garima Greh. They were provided with intensive 4 months training in Digital Literacy and English Language Literacy to make them employment ready. Most of them were absorbed in jobs post training. Laptops were donated to Garima Greh Residents to





After that we went for the observation where all childrens were having their breakfast i.e milk and chocos but breakfast they sing a song .After that we went to balwadi where the children were alloted for playing in group of three where their were beads activity, blocks,drawing,etc. After that we did riddles where we asked the Teacher to give story books for book treasure hunt activity for book week. After that we went to primary class where we made model of bakery with help of the children.In between they were getting snacks i.e banana and some calcium, protein medicine for weight gain .After that around 12.20 /12.30 they have their lunch time where they eat khichdi. One thing we observed that they were helping teacher to get utensil , washing their utensils after eating, brooming the classroom etc. Around 12.45 to 1.00 pm parents come to pick their children as they

have their lunch break. After children goes Teachers have their lunch break from 1:00 to 2:00 and we also had break from 1:00 to1.30 where we do lunch and after finishing lunch we dicuss and plan for next day.



#### On 2nd day i.e on 17th October

We reached around 9.05am they all were gathering around 9.30 they were having breakfast At 10.00 to 11.00 after breakfast we went to balwadi class where they taught the activity as given by teacher and had a rhymes section. After balwadi activity we went to primary class where with the help of few children we made a model of solar system. While other childres were having their normal class with the teachers.At 12.30 they had a lunch time. At that time we were giving finishing with left over work of the model Around 1.00 we had a break where we ate and dicussed and planned about the next day.


## On 4th day i.e 19th October


On day 5 i.e on 21st October







# DEPARTMENT OF SOCIOLOGY SOCIAL BONDING: Connecting with the community Project Sneh:

### **OBJECTIVES:**

- 1. To provide a platform to students to know about community life
- 2. To enable the students to understand the concept of community and life outside home
- 3. To increase the awareness about community development needs
- 4. To engage the students in the development of society/ community
- 5. To contribute and participate for a better society and nation

### **Engagement:**

The Department of Sociology has always been involved in community outreach programs and provided the students various platforms to get engaged through various avenues and syllabus-based activities.

The students are motivated to create awareness about various social issues like Dowry, female and child health, domestic violence, problems of elderly, Clean India, Girl child etc. through street plays using puppets at various public places like railway stations, colleges, municipal schools in college vicinity also in our college campus.

### The Journey:

The department is involved in teaching in Municipal schools since 2012-13 as part of APC-I Paper on Education and Society for SYBA students, since then we have continued this practice of teaching BMC school students of grade 5-8 using various teaching aids like flash cards and puppets. This practice continued till 2016 till our syllabus changed, but we continued our

engagement with students by visiting the J.K. Public school in Goregaon and engaging with school students by providing them puppet making skills using the discarded items at home and make learning enjoyable.

Since 2017 we have integrated the school teaching as part of community and extension activity and called it PROJECT SNEH, which is helping school students through various NGO's in helping them in various areas like Computers, language skills, good touch bad touch and many other.

### **OUTCOMES:**

Students look forward to participate in this project as they enjoy teaching and interacting with the school students and come up with various activities that are helpful for them. This project has helped students to come forward and share their skills, giving them an opportunity to reach others in need and has also build up their confidence and feel empowered as they open up easily with smaller children and also socially.

There has been an increase in students enrolling for ECCE and BEd. Courses after graduation helping them to have a career in teaching.




